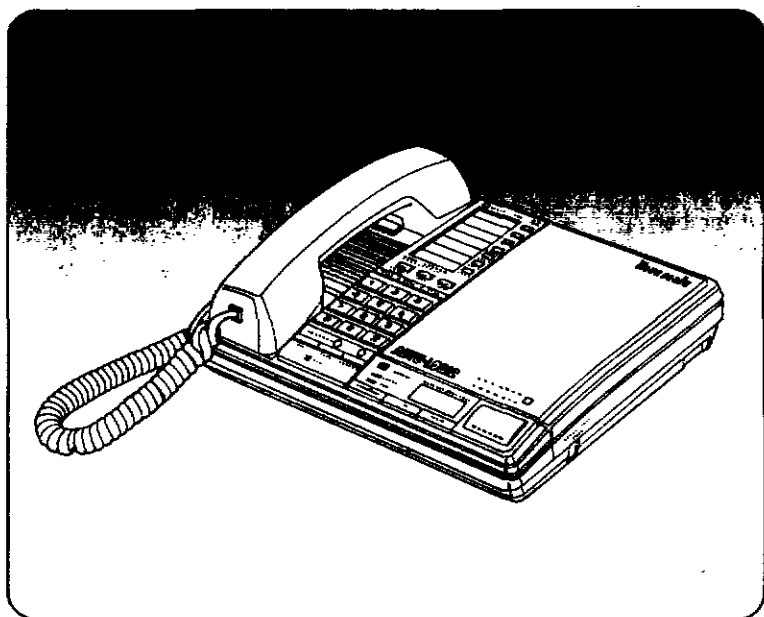

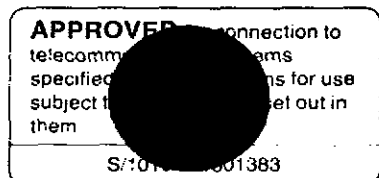

Please read before use.

Thank you for purchasing the Panasonic Integrated Telephone System with Telephone Answering Machine.

Do not connect the AC Adaptor to any AC outlet other than the standard AC 240 V, 50 Hz.

- The power supply unit complies with BS6301: 1982.
Outlet voltage AC 13 V, AC 600 mA.
- The apparatus is approved for use with the KX-A13DBE power supply.
- Caution: Do not remove cover. Live parts inside.



Ringer Equivalence Number (REN):

This relates to the performance of the integrated telephone with answering machine when used in combination with other items of apparatus. It enables the calculation of the maximum number of items of apparatus that may be connected simultaneously to the line by summing REN values of each item. A maximum REN value of 4 should not be exceeded and will always include a BT provided telephone. The REN value of a BT Telephone is assumed to be 1. The REN value of this I.T.A.M is 1.

Method of connection

This is connected to the exchange line or PABX/PMBX extension by the new standard British Telecom plug and socket. Arrangements for provision of this type of termination can be made through the nearest British Telecom Sales Office.

The Easa-Phone may be connected to the following types of installation. The telephone has been approved for use under the following conditions;

- (a) For connection to the public switched telephone network (PSTN) and compatible (Private Branch Exchange), which use loop disconnect signalling and DTMF signalling. (Please consult your supplier for an up to date list of compatible PBX's.)
- (b) The telephone can be used on extension sockets connected to a direct exchange line (D.E.L.).
- (c) This apparatus is suitable for connection to the telecommunication system directly or via compatible private branch exchange as an extension.

The supplier of the apparatus should be consulted for an up to date list of PBX's with which the apparatus is compatible.

It cannot be guaranteed that the apparatus will operate under all possible conditions of connection to compatible PBX's.

- This equipment is suitable for connection to a PBX with or without initial proceed indication.
- This equipment is suitable for connection to a PBX with or without secondary proceed indication.

Any cases of difficulty should be referred in the first instance to the supplier of the apparatus.

Any other usage will invalidate the approval of the apparatus if as a result, it then ceases to conform to the standards against which approval was granted.

(d) The telephone must not be connected in the following manner:

- 1) As an extension to a pay phone
- 2) As a party line with shared service
- 3) As part of A 1+1 carrier system

NOTE:

- If you experience any problems with the normal use of your unit, you should unplug it from the telephone outlet and connect a known working telephone in its place.
- If the known working telephone still gives problems, then call British Telecom Engineers: if it operates properly, then the problem is likely to be a fault in your unit. In this case, contact your supplier for advice.
- British Telecom will charge you if they attend a service call that is not due to equipment supplied by them.

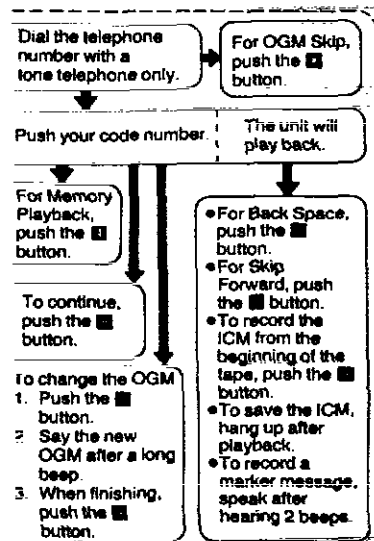

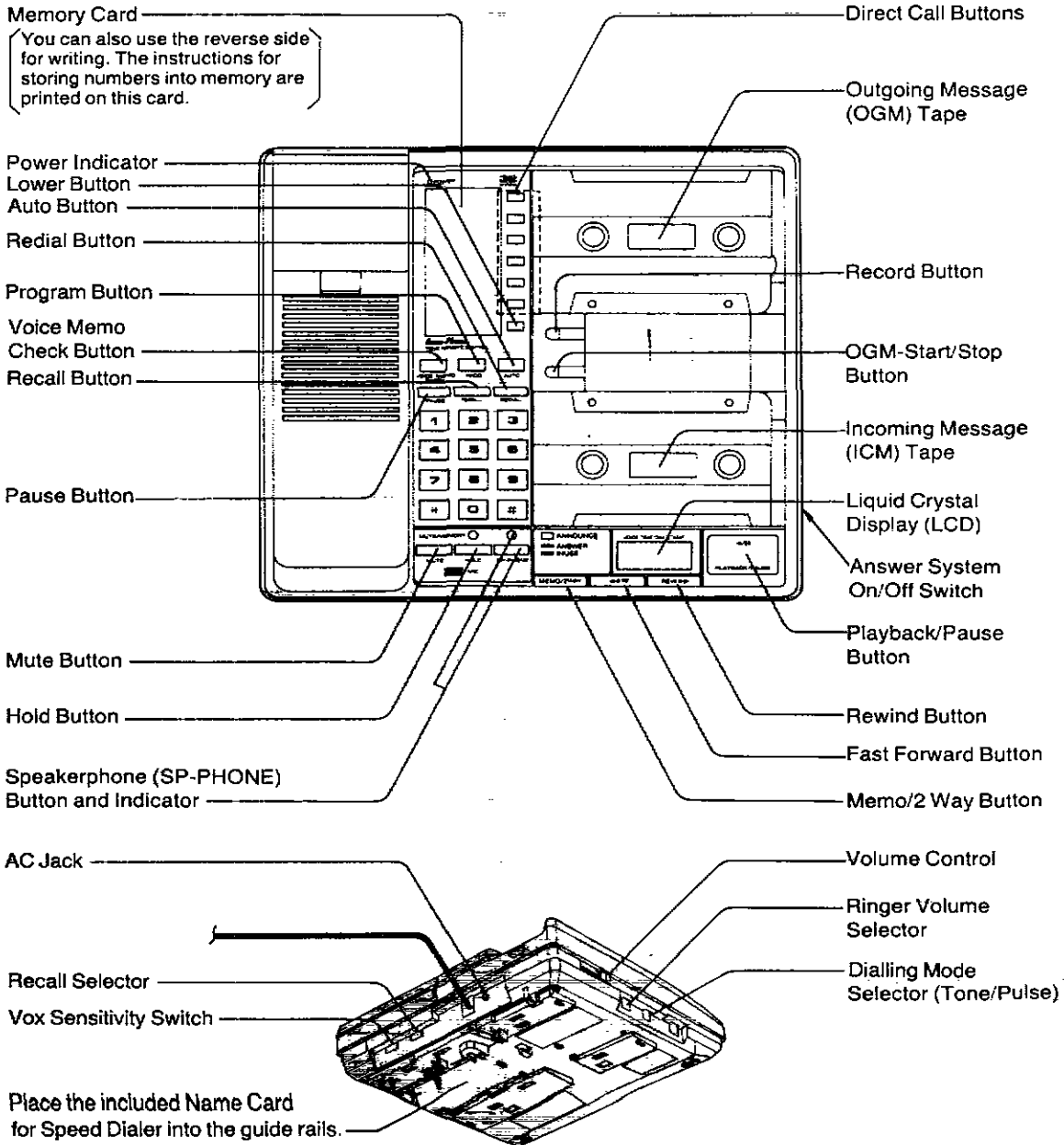

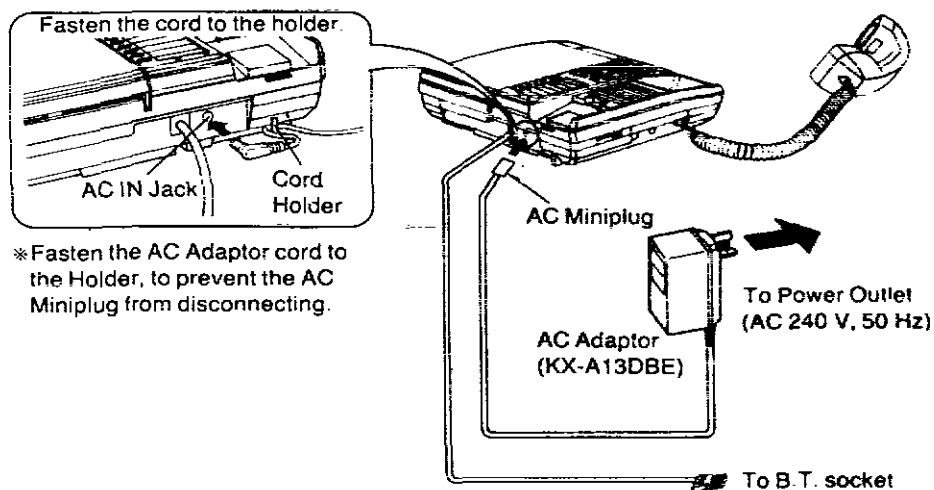

- This unit is designed to be connected as shown.



- The AC adaptor supplies the unit with operation power.
- Do not use any AC adaptor other than the Panasonic Model KX-A13DBE.
- While operating the unit the cabinet may feel warm, this is quite normal.

Be sure to use the AC adaptor.
If a power failure takes place, the unit can be used as a typical telephone.

999 can be dialled on the apparatus for the purposes of making outgoing calls to the BT emergency (999) Service.

Preparation

Helpful Hints for Hands-free

- **When the other party finds it difficult to hear your voice:**

Lower the sound level using the Speaker Volume Control or speak louder.

- **Absorbing echo:**

Use in a room which has curtains or carpeting.

- **Note:**

If you and the caller speak at the same time, parts of your conversation will be lost. To avoid this, speak alternately.

Automatic Dialling

Speed Dialling (20 memory stations):

There are 20 memory stations (for Speed Dialling), each station is capable of storing 16 digits. Each memory station can be accessed by dialling two digits on the dial pad.

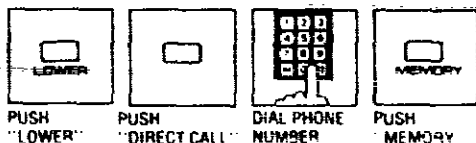
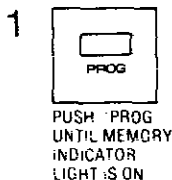
One-Touch Dialling (12 memory stations):

There are 6 Direct Call buttons (for One-Touch Dialling), each Direct Call button consists of two functions, they are **upper** and **lower** memory locations. Each location (Upper + Lower) is capable of storing 16 digits.

Storing Phone Numbers

Be sure the handset is on the cradle and SP-PHONE button is off.

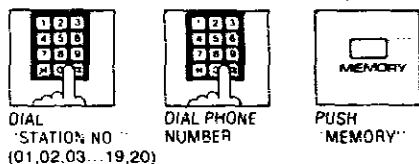
Another phone number can be stored in the lower memory section of the same station.

Speed Dialling

For each station No., dial 2 digits.



- Phone numbers can be stored into memory station 01 to 20 following the above procedure. You can program one or all of the stations once the unit is set to program.

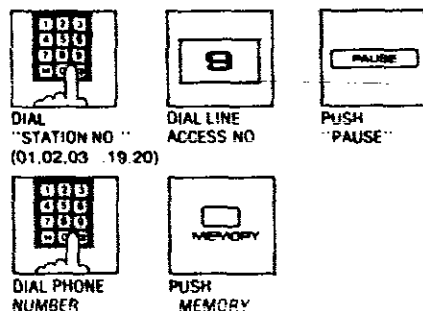

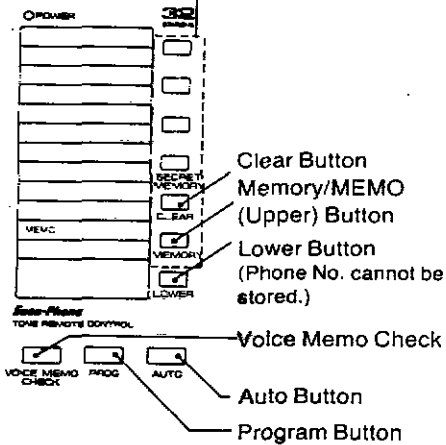

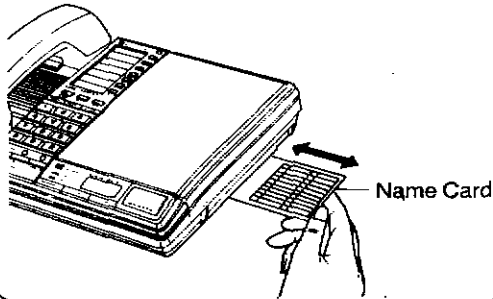


Notes:

- Secret memory, Clear and Memory buttons are also memory stations. Programming is exactly the same as the other buttons.
- Do not disconnect the AC adaptor and the telephone cord for over 30 minutes, or the stored phone number may be lost and reprogram will be required.

Name Card for Speed Dialer

For your convenience, fill in the Name Card and insert the guide rails on the bottom of the unit (see page 4). When dialling, the 20 memory stations can be found at sight.



Correcting an Error while Storing

If you notice an error before pressing the Memory button.

- 1 Push instead of the until the Memory Indicator light comes on.
- 2 Repeat step 2 of "Storing Phone Numbers".

Confirming a Stored Number

- 1 Repeat storing the same number into the same station.
- 2 When the is pushed, the Memory Indicator will flash and a beep will be heard.

•twice:

The entry is the same as what was previously stored.

•once:

The entry is different from the one that was previously stored. Repeat the procedure of storing.

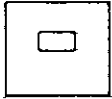

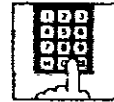

Other Features

- The voice memo check will function while the unit is in Answer mode or during the Answer system power is off. This feature will not function in the other mode (such as In-use mode.)
- The unit will announce only phone number stored and will not announce "PAUSE", "RECALL", "#" and "*".

Tone Button Usage

If you want to change from pulse mode into tone mode during dialling, the Tone ()

button can be used instead of changing the Dialling Mode Selector.

When you hang up the handset, Dialling Mode will return to pulse mode.

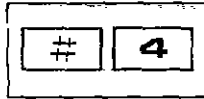
Initial Setting

- Select the Caller's Recording time and the Number of rings.
- Caller's Recording time can be set to "1 minute", "VOX" or "Announce Only".
- Number of rings can be set to "2 rings", "3 rings", "4 rings" or "LONG".

The unit will record up to 1 minute.
• The display shows "L".

■ VOX (Unlimited):

The unit will record for as long as the caller speaks.

The unit will play back the Outgoing message and will not record any Incoming messages.
• The display shows "AO".

2 rings: answers on the second ring

• The display shows "2".

3 rings: answers on the third ring

• The display shows "3".

4 rings: answers on the fourth ring

• The display shows "4".

LONG: When the unit is used on an extension of PMBX which uses manual ringing, set to "LONG". The unit will answer on the first ring.

• The display shows "L".

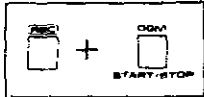
Note:

It is important that your caller does not pause for more than 4 seconds while leaving their message.

OGM Recording (Outgoing Message)

The purpose of the Outgoing message is to inform the calling party that you cannot answer the call, but want to record the caller's message.

Recording



PUSH UNTIL A BEEP
SOUND IS HEARD



SPEAK INTO
MIC



WHEN FINISHED,
PUSH AGAIN

- 1 Push the "REC" button, while holding it, push the "OGM START/STOP" button until the beep sound is heard.
- 2 Speak clearly and loudly into the MIC.
 - Speak for up to 30 seconds about 8 inches away from the MIC.
 - While recording, do not pause for over 2 seconds.
 - The LC-Display will show "0" → "1" → "2" → "3" → "30".
- 3 When finished, push "OGM START/STOP" button.
 - Wait until the In Use Indicator goes out.
 - A series of short beeps will be heard to advance the tape followed by a long beep signalling that the unit is at the beginning of the tape.
 - If you make a mistake, repeat from step 1.

Confirming



- Push "OGM START/STOP" button.
- Adjust the volume control to confirm.
- Wait until the In Use Indicator goes out.

Re-recording

If you want to record again, repeat from step 1.

Samples of Outgoing Messages

- Set Recording Time to "1 Minute" or "Vox".

Hello, this is (the Panasonic Company). We cannot answer your call at this time. If you leave your name and phone number, we will return your call as soon as possible. Speak clearly after you hear the beep.

(You have 1 minute to leave your message.)

If "End of tape" is announced, your message will not be recorded. Should this happen please call back tomorrow.

Thank you for calling.

Note:

When the ICM tape is nearly full, the unit will not record any more messages. This is indicated to the caller by the announcement. If you wish to inform the caller of this possibility, add the sentences (printed in bold-face above) to your OGM recording.

- Set Recording Time to "Announce Only".

Hello, this is (the Panasonic Company). We are not able to answer your call at this time. Please call us again tomorrow, after 9 AM. Thank you for calling.

The unit will automatically change to the Answer mode after 7 seconds from when the In Use Indicator goes out.

And the unit will announce the day and time.

Note

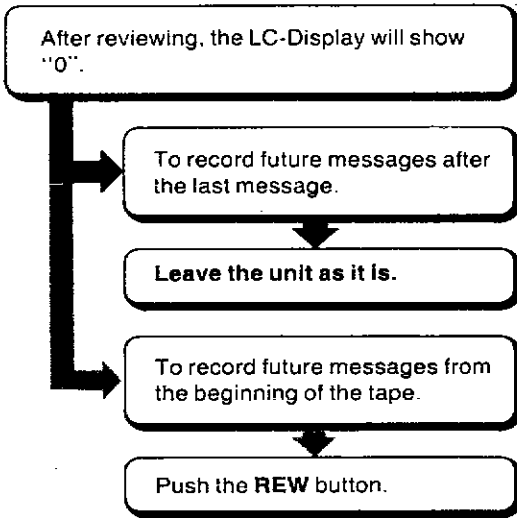
If you pause for over 2 seconds while recording, a beep will sound 6 times and the unit will announce "Please record your Outgoing message again.". If this happens, wait until the In Use Indicator goes out and start with step 1 again.

Prior to Leaving

The unit will automatically set to the Answer mode by simply pushing the Answer System On/Off Switch. When the telephone rings, the unit will play back the OGM, then it will record the Caller's messages and the time and day of the message will be recorded on the ICM tape.

Preparation

After reviewing the Outgoing or Incoming message the unit will automatically reset itself to the Answer mode and will be ready to answer the next call.



- If you use a new ICM tape or record future messages from the beginning of the tape, push the REW button.
- Confirm that the Answer Indicator light is on and that the LC-Display shows "0".
- If you do not want to set the unit to the Answer mode, set the Answer System On/Off Switch to off.

Listening to Messages

When an Incoming message (ICM) has been recorded, the LC-Display will show the number of calls and the Answer Indicator will flash. In the case of a power interruption, the LC-Display will show "--" after the power is restored.

To Listen to Messages




- Push the "Playback/Pause" button to listen to the recorded messages.


Auto-Logic (One Touch Operation)

The unit will announce the number of messages received and the ICM tape will automatically rewind and begin to play back. At the end of all the messages "End of final message" will be heard. 7 seconds after "End of final message" is announced the unit will reset back to the Answer mode.

- The unit will announce the time and day when the Incoming message was recorded.
- **Future Incoming messages will be recorded after the last message.**
To record from the beginning of the tape, push the Rewind button.

- To stop the tape temporarily, push the Playback/Pause button. (The In Use Indicator will flash.)
To restart, push it again.

-  **REW** to rewind the tape.

-  **FFF** to fast forward the tape.

Voice Time/Day Stamp

When the messages are received, a voice synthesized announcement of the time and day will be recorded on the ICM tape after recording message.

Other Features



Monitoring an Incoming Call

While an Incoming call is being recorded, you can hear it

- 1 Adjust the Volume Control.
To talk to the caller directly during recording of the Incoming call, lift the handset.
 - The ICM tape will stop after recording the synthesized voice of time and day.




Recording a Conversation (2-Way Recording)

IMPORTANT: Please ensure that you have programmed the unit for this function. (See "preparation" on page 6.)

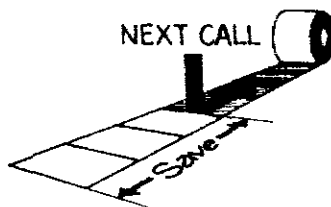
- 1 Confirm the Answer System On/Off Switch is set to On.
 - The Power Indicator light is on.
- 2 While having a conversation,
 **MEMO/2WAY** until a beep sound is heard.

 - A beep will sound every 15 seconds.
- 3 When you finish recording,
 **MEMO/2WAY** again.

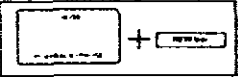

You may record a confidential message any time at home on the ICM tape.

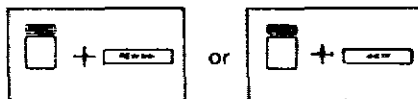

 - The unit will be ready to answer the next call.

Saving the Recorded Messages



- 1 Play back the tape to the message you want to save.
- 2 
 - Push "PLAYBACK/PAUSE" and "REW" button simultaneously.
 - The unit will go into the Answer mode and future Incoming messages will be recorded after the messages you have saved.

Erasing the Recorded Messages



- Push "REC" button, while holding it, push "FF" or "REW" button until a beep sound is heard.
- The messages are erased while rewinding or fast forwarding.
- The cassette can be erased at high speed even if the record-prevention (knock-out) tabs have been removed.



How to Operate from Remote Phone

You can retrieve the recorded Incoming messages from a remote location using a tone telephone. Remote operation is simplified by a **synthesized voice** that offers you options over the telephone.

To Store the Remote Code Number

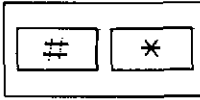
Before operation, choose a one-digit through three-digit remote code number and store it in memory.

Example: 358

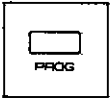

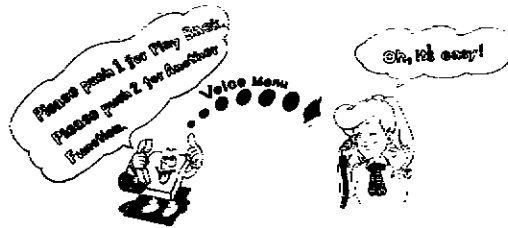
Remote Synthesized Voice Instruction (Voice Menu)

The synthesized voice will give you the direction how to operate your unit from a remote location using a tone telephone. You can easily play back the received messages, re-record the OGM, or record "Marker Message" etc., according to the "Voice Menu" without any manuals. To operate the unit directly skipping the order of the Voice Menu, see page 21.

Example:

Playing back the received messages.

- 1) Call your unit.
- 2) Push your **Remote Code No.** firmly during the OGM playback.
 - The voice will tell you how many messages you have received.
- 3) After 5 seconds, the voice will say; **"Please push 1 for Play Back. Please push 2 for another function".**
- 4) Push the "1" to play back the received messages.
 - The unit will play back all the recorded messages.



How to Operate from Remote Phone (cont.)

Remote Synthesized Voice Instruction (cont.)

Play Back

The unit will rewind the tape even if the tape is full and play back all the recorded messages.

Note:

During remote operation, the tape will be stopped and then 2 beeps will be heard in the following conditions:

- 2 minutes 40 seconds after your unit answered.
- Every 2 minutes 40 seconds after pushing the command button.

To hear further messages, push the "8" (Continue Button) within 10 seconds of the 2 beeps.

- After the last message, the voice will say: "**End of final message.**"
- If you want to operate in succession, wait for 5 seconds. The unit will re-start Voice Menu from the beginning.
- If "**End of tape**" is announced, the ICM tape is nearly full.

Memory Play Back

The unit will play back the newly recorded messages.

Reset

The unit will rewind the tape to the beginning.

Marker Message

You can leave your index message on the ICM tape.

- 1) Start to talk right after "**Marker Message**" is announced.
- 2) When finished, hang up.

Recording OGM

You can re-record the OGM remotely.

The voice will say:

"Please push 7 to start. Please push 9 to end."

1) Push the "7".

- Short beeps will be heard continuously until the OGM tape has reset and then a long beep will be heard.

2) Speak clearly and loudly after the long beep.
3) When finished, push the "9".

- The new Outgoing message will be play back. So you can check or amend it.
- If you pause for over 2 seconds while recording, the unit will sound 6 beeps and announce "**Please record your Outgoing message again.**"

If this happens, repeat from step 1.

To rewind/fast forward/reset during playback

Push the "9" while messages are being played, the voice will say:

"Please push 1 for Back Space, 2 for Skip, 3 for Reset."

Troubleshooting Guide



Problem

The unit does not work when I push any buttons.

When the tape is played back, the sound level is low, even if the Volume Control is turned up fully.

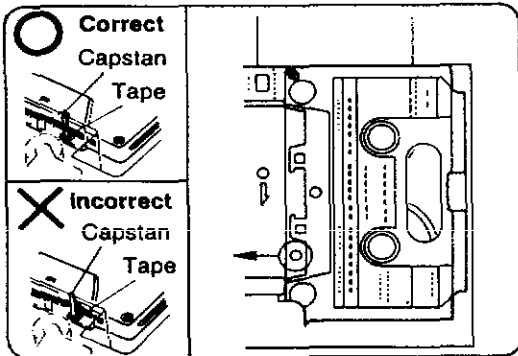


Cassette Tapes

- For optimum sound quality and performance, we recommend you to **replace the OGM and the ICM cassette tapes every six months** and to **re-record the outgoing message every three months** supposing that the unit answers calls about ten times every day.
- Never place cassette tape near a magnetic source, such as a magnet or a TV set, because this will affect tape quality.

Endless Cassette Tape (KX-C030) for Outgoing Message

- A sensing foil (silver) is attached to the endless tape. If the sensing foil does not contact the sensing switch, the endless tape cannot stop automatically. Replace it with a new Panasonic endless cassette tape (KX-C030).
- Observe carefully that the tape and capstan are located as shown below, and insert the endless tape into the machine.

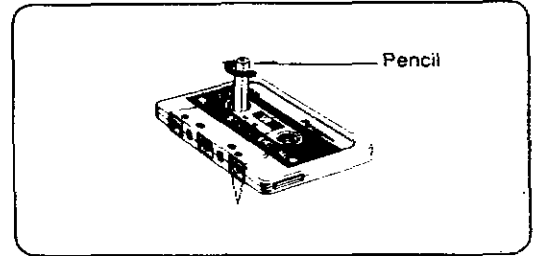

Cassette Tape (C-60) for Incoming Messages

- Should the Incoming Message cassette tape break or become worn, replace it with a high quality "NORMAL" tape. Use Panasonic (C-30, C-60, C-90), or other high quality tape. Metal or chrome tape cannot be used.
- Slack in the tape can be tightened by rotating the tape reel with a pencil, as shown:



- Do not use C-120 tape to prevent the tape from sticking.

Maintenance

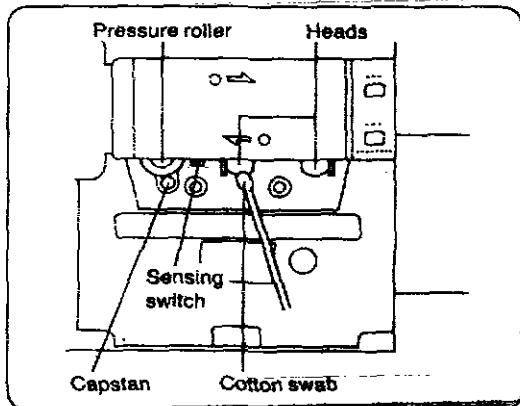
Because the head and capstan assemblies are in contact with the tape, dirt and residue from the tape can easily adhere to these parts, causing distortion. These parts should be cleaned periodically in the manner described below:

- Disconnect the telephone cord from the socket before cleaning.
- Clean the head surfaces, sensing switch, pressure rollers and capstans with a cotton swab.

If these surfaces are extremely dirty, dampen the cotton swab with alcohol.

Notes:

- Do not bring magnetic or metal objects, such as a screwdriver, near the head assemblies, as such objects could magnetize the heads.
- Do not oil any part of the unit.



Others

- If there is any trouble, disconnect the unit from the telephone line and connect a known working phone. If the known working phone operates properly, return your unit to your supplier for repair. If the known working phone does not operate properly, contact British Telecom.
- Do not use benzine, thinner, or similar solvents. Do not use abrasive powder to clean the cabinet. Wipe it with a soft cloth.
- Keep the unit away from heating appliances and electrical noise generating devices such as fluorescent lamps, motors and television. These noise sources can interfere with the performance of the EASA-PHONE.
- This unit and the cassette tapes should be kept free of dust, moisture, high temperature and vibration, and should not be exposed to direct sunlight.
- Never attempt to insert wires, pins, etc. into the vents or other holes of this unit.
