Safety

IMPORTANT

Read this information before using your wireless handheld phone.

Exposure To Radio Frequency Signals

Your wireless handheld portable telephone is a low power radio transmitter and receiver. When it is ON, it receives and also sends out radio frequency (RF) signals.

International agencies have set standards and recommendations for the protection of public exposure to RF electromagnetic energy.

- International Commission on Non-Ionizing Radiation Protection (ICNIRP) 1996
- Verband Deutscher Elektrotechniker (VDE) DIN-0848
- United States Federal Communications Commission, Radio Frequency Exposure Guidelines (1996)
- National Radiological Protection Board of the United Kingdom, GS 11, 1988
- American National Standards Institute (ANSI) IEEE. C95. 1-1992
- National Council on Radiation Protection and Measurements (NCRP). Report 86
- Ministry of Health (Canada), Safety Code 6

These standards are based on extensive scientific review. For example, over 120 scientists, engineers, and physicians from universities, government health agencies, and industry reviewed the available body of research to develop the updated ANSI standard.

The design of your phone complies with these standards when used normally.

Antenna Care

Use only the supplied or an approved replacement antenna. Unauthorized antennas, modifications, or attachments could damage the phone and may violate local agency regulations.

Phone Operation

Normal Position

Hold the phone as you would any other telephone, with the antenna pointed up and over your shoulder.

Tips on Efficient Operation

Observe the following guidelines to operate your phone most efficiently.

- Extend your antenna fully, if applicable.
- Do not touch the antenna unnecessarily when the phone is in use. Contact with the antenna affects call quality and may cause the phone to operate at a higher power level than otherwise needed.

Batteries

CAUTION: All batteries can cause property damage, injury, or burns if a conductive material, such as jewelry, keys or beaded chains, touches exposed terminals. The material may complete an electrical circuit and become quite hot. To protect against such unwanted current drain, exercise care in handling any charged battery, particularly when placing it inside your pocket, purse, or other container with metal objects. When the battery is detached from the phone, your batteries are packed with a

protective battery cover; please use this cover for storing your batteries when not in use.

Driving

Check the laws and regulations on the use of wireless telephones in the areas where you drive. Always obey them. Observe the following guidelines when using your phone while driving.

- Give full attention to driving--driving safely is your first responsibility.
- Use hands-free phone operation, if available.
- Pull off the road and park before making or answering a call if driving conditions so require.

Electronic Devices

Most modern electronic equipment is shielded from RF signals. However, certain equipment may not be shielded against the RF signals from your wireless phone.

Pacemakers

The Health Industry Manufacturers Association recommends that a minimum separation of six inches (6") be maintained between a handheld wireless phone and a pacemaker to avoid potential interference with the pacemaker. These recommendations are consistent with the independent research by and recommendations of Wireless Technology Research.

Persons with pacemakers:

- should **ALWAYS** keep the phone more than six inches from their pacemaker when the phone is turned **ON**
- should not carry the phone in a breast pocket
- should use the ear opposite the pacemaker to minimize the potential for interference
- should turn the phone **OFF** immediately if you have any reason to suspect that interference is taking place

Hearing Aids

Some digital wireless phones may interfere with some hearing aids. In the event of such interference, you may want to consult your hearing aid manufacturer to discuss alternatives.

Other Medical Devices

If you use any other personal medical device, consult the manufacturer of your device to determine if it is adequately shielded from external RF energy. Your physician may be able to assist you in obtaining this information.

Turn your phone **OFF** in health care facilities when any regulations posted in these areas instruct you to do so. Hospitals or health care facilities may be using equipment that could be sensitive to external RF energy.

Vehicles

RF signals may affect improperly installed or inadequately shielded electronic systems in motor vehicles. Check with the manufacturer or its representative regarding your vehicle. You should also consult the manufacturer of any equipment that has been added to your vehicle.

Posted Facilities

Turn your phone **OFF** in any facility where posted notices so require.

Aircraft

Switch **OFF** your phone before boarding an aircraft.

Airline regulations prohibit using your phone while in the air. Check and comply with the policy of your airline regarding the use of your phone while the aircraft is on the ground.

Blasting Areas

To avoid interfering with blasting operations, turn your phone **OFF** when in a “blasting area” or in areas posted: “Turn off two-way radio.” Obey all signs and instructions.

Potentially Explosive Atmospheres

Turn your phone **OFF**, do not remove your battery when you are in any area with a potentially explosive atmosphere, and obey all signs and instructions. Sparks from your battery in such areas could cause an explosion or fire resulting in bodily injury or even death.

Areas with a potentially explosive atmosphere are often but not always clearly marked. They include fueling areas such as gasoline stations; below deck on boats; fuel or chemical transfer or storage facilities; areas where fuel odors are present (for example, if a gas/propane leak occurs in a car or home); areas where the air contains chemicals or particles, such as grain, dust, or metal powders; and any other area where you normally would be advised to turn off your vehicle engine.

For Vehicles Equipped with an Air Bag

An air bag inflates with great force. **Do NOT** place objects, including both installed or portable wireless equipment, in the area over the air bag or in the air bag deployment area. If in-vehicle wireless equipment is improperly installed and the air bag inflates, serious injury could result.

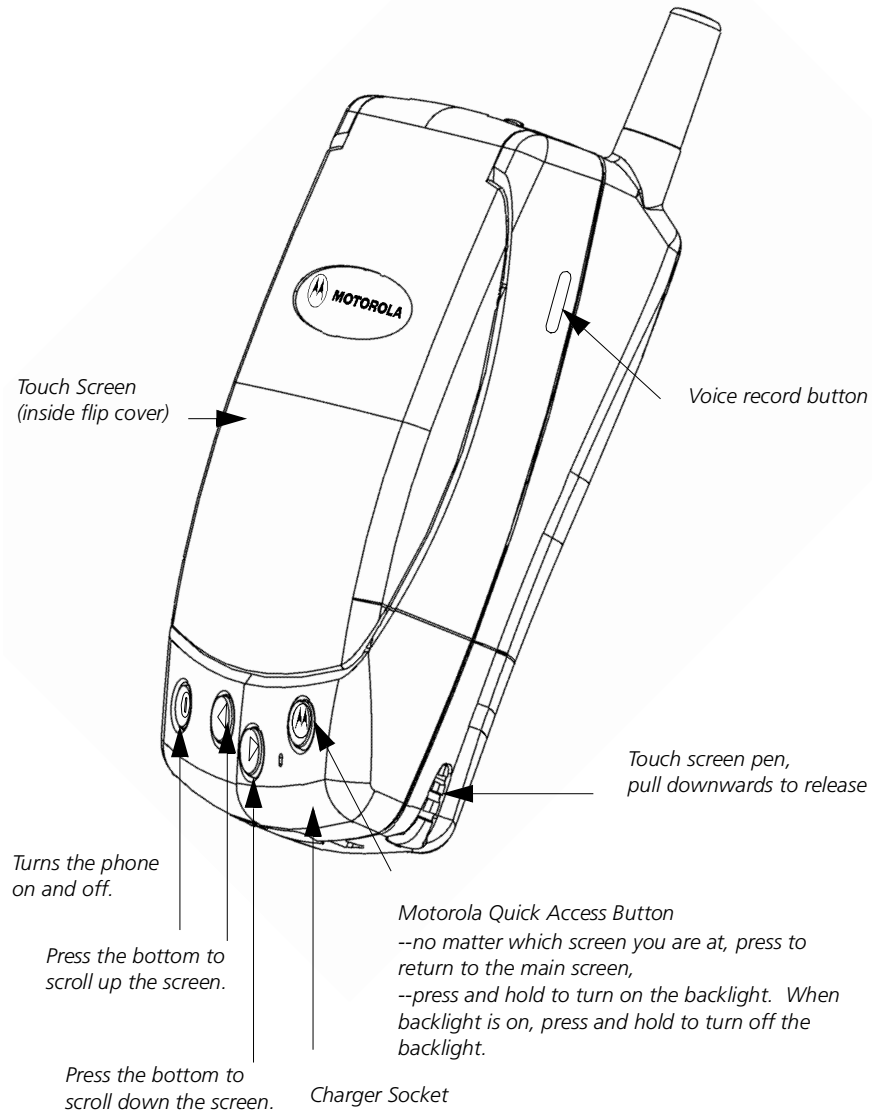

External Features

Using the Phone

Every aspects of the phone put you in control and give you unrivalled power.....

Rolling the button upwards: To increase the volume / To "Move Forward"

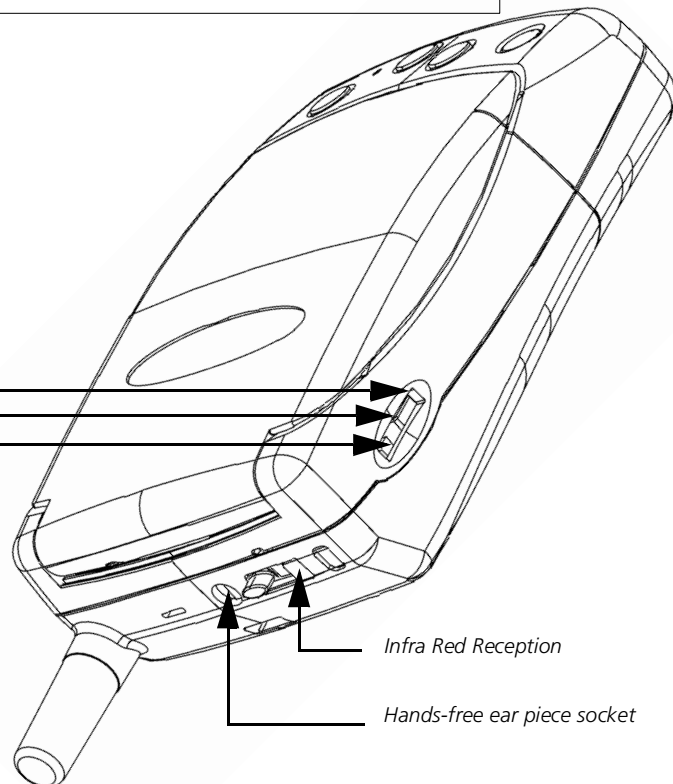
- to increase the ear piece volume during a phone call

Rolling the button downwards: To decrease the volume / To "Move Backwards"

- to decrease the ear piece volume during a phone call
- in the main menu screen, "Move Backwards" to select the various functional symbols
- in the display, "Move Backwards" to select the various display selections
- in the dialogue box, 'Move Backwards" to select the various buttons
- to turn off the Ringer or VibraCall when the phone is ringing or vibrating.

Pressing the button inwards : The Smart Button

- to answer a phone call upon opening the flip.
- to answer a phone call upon connecting to an ear piece
- Last number redial (in new edition)
- selection functions



SIM Card / Battery

SIM card is a smart card provided by the mobile communications service provider. It stores the phone number supplied to you by the service provider and other service details. Your handset is connected to the network via the SIM card, enabling it to have the various communications functions. The SIM card also allows you to store important phone numbers and other information. In fact, you can use your SIM card on any GSM handset and you will be charged for the call.

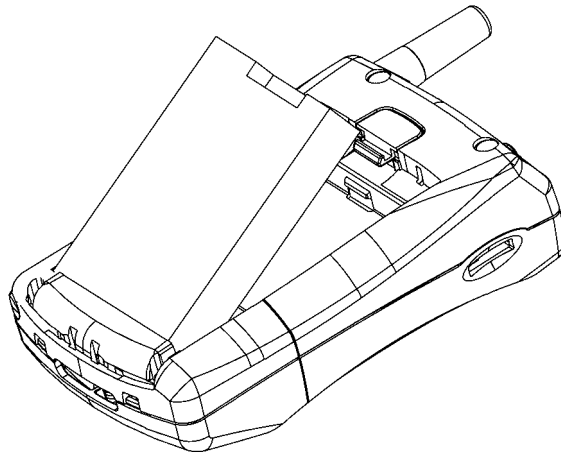
! *You will not be able to make or receive calls or send messages if you do not have a SIM card inserted into your phone. Some networks allow you to make emergency calls without a SIM card inserted.*

! *Like a bank or credit card, you should keep your SIM card secure. Do not bend or scratch your card and avoid exposure to static electricity or water.*

! *Switch off your phone before inserting or removing the SIM card. Failure to do so may damage the memory of your SIM card.*

Follow the steps below while changing the battery or inserting the SIM card (for first time use, you can skip the step on battery removal).

- 1 Press the release catch on the battery compartment and lift off the cover by sliding off the bottom of the phone
- 2 Push the battery towards the bottom of the phone and lift the battery out from the bottom end.




- 3 Slide the SIM cover and lift up the cover.
- 4 Place the SIM card into the recess in the base of the phone, making sure that the corner of the SIM card fits the recess corner.
- 5 Replace the SIM cover, then press and slide it to lock it in place.
- 6 Align the connections on the battery with the connections on the phone. Press the battery towards the connections and push it downwards
- 7 Slide back the cover until it clicks into place.

! *After inserting the SIM card, turn on the phone. If the SIM card is inserted in the wrong way round, damaged or there is no SIM, Check Card message may be shown*


in the screen. If so, remove the SIM card, check that it is the right way round and then re-insert it into the phone.


■ If either of the Bad Card, See Supplier ,Locked, See Supplier messages are displayed, then you will need to contact your cellular service provider.

Tips: Regarding the battery

 To ensure maximum battery performance, a new battery (or a battery that has not been used for several months) should be charged for at least 14 hours before use (but NOT more than 24 hours).

A new battery will require several full charge / discharge cycles in order to achieve its optimum performance.

 A new battery, or a battery that has not been used for several months, may cause a prematurely fully charged indication. Ignore this indication and let the battery charge for several more hours.

 Do not use lithium ion batteries at extremely low temperatures as the maximum standby / talk time will not be available when cold.

Battery Performance and Maintenance

- Best battery performance will be achieved when you regularly charge and discharge batteries as instructed in this manual
- Battery performance is greatly affected by network coverage.
- Set "Battery Saving Mode" to on (see Phone Setup menu) and / or "Frequency of Search" to slow or medium (see Network Setup menu).
- If left unused, a fully charged battery will discharge itself in approximately one month.
- When not in use, store your battery uncharged in a cool, dark and dry place.

Important Battery Information



Always treat your batteries with care. See the Safety Information on batteries.

- Never leave your batteries in extremely high temperatures (over 60 degrees Celsius), for example near the window, under the direct sunlight.
- Only Motorola Original Accessory batteries can be charged in the phone or the optional desktop charger. This is to protect you and your phone from the risks of incorrect charging.

Charging

Your handset allows you to monitor your battery level by showing the battery level indicator. When the battery is completely discharged, your phone will turn off. When "Low Battery" is displayed on the screen, you should take the following steps:

Low battery level:

when the battery level is low and only a few minutes of talk time remain, a warning signal (two beeps) will sound, the battery symbol will begin to flash, and "Low Battery" will be displayed, prompting you to charge your battery. In addition, the top right corner of the screen will display  or  , indicating that the battery level is low.

Insert battery:


the display will prompt you to insert the battery if you have connected the phone to an external current mains before inserting the battery.

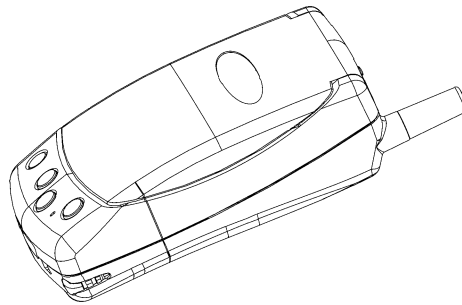
Invalid battery:




this display will be accompanied by a warning beep. This is to warn you that the battery cannot be re-charged (though the battery can provide power to the phone). This may indicate that the battery is not Motorola Original Accessory Battery. It is suggested that you use only Motorola Original Batteries and other accessories as Motorola will not be held responsible for any damage to the phone, financial loss or bodily injuries arising from the use of non-Motorola original other batteries and accessories.

A Travel Charger will be able to charge a battery fitted in a phone (as well as providing power to the phone directly. To charge a battery using the travel charger:

- 1 Make sure that the phone is fitted with a battery;
- 2 Connect the charger to the charger socket of the phone;
- 3 Insert the charger plug into a suitable mains power socket.

 **Important!** Please make sure that the local mains (?) voltage at your location matches that of your charger.



- 4 When it starts to charge, you will hear an alert beep and the screen will show "Charging". Charging can take place when the phone is on or off. When the phone is on, charging does not affect the normal operation of the phone. The top right corner of the screen will display  or , indicating that the battery is charging.
- 5 When charging is completed, the screen will show " Charging Complete". Disconnect the phone from the power mains socket connection. When you turn on the phone, the top right hand corner of the screen shows , indicating that the charging is completed.

Switching The Phone On

Due to the superior functions of the Motorola A6188, it possesses many different options to turn on the phone:

Under normal situations (in the case of a new phone or without changing the default phone settings), please refer to the phone mode.

When you require the diary, memo pad or calculator etc, please refer to the PDA mode.

After setting the PIN, handset number lock and other selections, please refer to the phone mode for the complete process of turning on the phone.


Phone Mode

⚠ *As this mode transmits the wireless radio frequency which may affect the normal operation of some electronic equipment, please ensure that safety regulations are adhered to before activating the phone mode.*


⚠ *Do not turn on the phone mode on board the planes.*

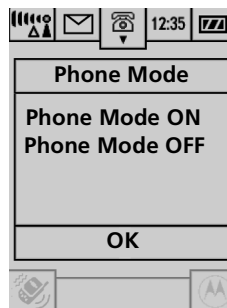
Methods to turn on the phone:

The first method:

Flip open the flip then press and hold the  button for a short while (about 1 to 2 seconds) before releasing the button.

The second method:


- 1 Flip open the flip then press and hold the  button for about 4 to 5 seconds (until the screen shows the mode of operation in the dialogue box) before releasing the button.
- 2 The screen shows the mode of operation in the dialogue box:

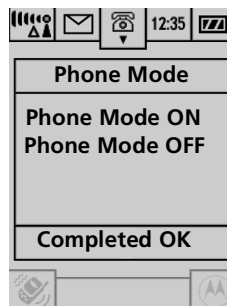


- 3 Select **ON** to turn on the phone mode; under this mode, you can make phone calls and send messages. Then press **OK** to confirm your selection.


👉 Note: *The above 2 methods will only work if you have not pre-set the phone PIN and the SIM card PIN. Please refer to the "Complete Process of Turning On the Phone".*

PDA Mode

- 1 Flip open the flip then press and hold the  button for about 4 to 5 seconds (until the screen shows the mode of operation in the dialogue box) before releasing the button.
- 2 The screen shows the mode of operation in the dialogue box:




- 3 Select **OFF** to turn off the phone mode and select the PDA mode; under this mode, you cannot make phone calls and send messages. Then press OK to confirm your selection.

 *Note: Besides using the above method to activate the PDA mode, you can also refer to the "Complete Process of Turning On the Phone" to activate the PDA mode.*

Complete Process of Turning On the Phone

If you have pre-set the PIN, phone number lock and manual selection of network (refer to Systems Setup), you will need a few more steps to turn on the phone mode. But it also enhances the security of your phone and the versatility of its functions.

Flip open the flap then press and hold the  button got a short while, about 1 to 2 seconds:


If the SIM card is not inserted, locked, not registered or damaged, the screen will show the following 2 selections:

Press to OFF the phone: the phone will be turned off

Press to confirm: the phone will operate in the PDA mode.

If the SIM card is working and the PIN is set (refer to PIN settings), the screen will prompt you to key in your PIN as follows:




To get into the "PDA" mode, simply select PDA to turn on the phone. Alternatively, key in your PIN (for security reasons, the screen will only show * to represent each digit; to correct the last digit, simply press  to delete the last digit) and then press Enter to confirm your selection and get into the phone mode.

If the PIN is incorrect, the screen will show "Wrong Pin".

You can either:


Select PDA, and get into the PDA mode.

Select "Retry" to key in the PIN again.

 *The SIM card will be automatically locked upon 3 consecutive keying of the wrong PIN. Please refer to the "Systems Setup" to unlock the SIM card or contact your service provider.*

If you have set up the phone number lock (refer to Phone Number Lock Settings), the screen will prompt you to key in your number lock to unlock the phone. Please key in the number lock using the same method as keying in your PIN.

If the wrong number lock is keyed in, the screen will show "Wrong Number Lock" and you have to retry. The phone will be turned off and locked automatically (even the PDA mode cannot work) if you keyed in the wrong number lock for 3 consecutive times.

 *Refer to the "Systems Setup" to pre-set the PIN and Phone Number Lock*

If the correct PIN and Phone Number Lock have been keyed in, the screen will show the "Phone Mode" dialogue box. Select **ON** to activate the phone mode, then press **OK** to confirm the selection. The phone will then scan for the network.

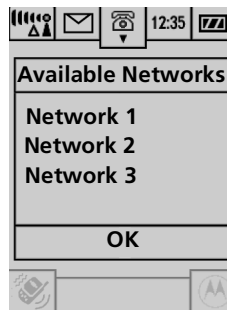
If the phone is pre-set with "Automatic Network Selection" (see "Network Settings" under "Network Setup"), the main menu will appear after scanning and selecting an available network.

The process of turning on a phone is completed.

If the phone is pre-set with "Manual Network Selection", the screen will prompt you to select the communication services. You can either:

Press **Cancel** to select the PDA mode.

Press **OK** to select a network from the available networks:



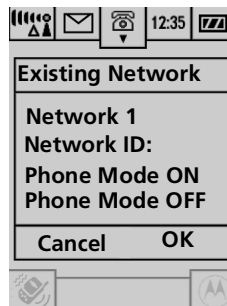
Press **Cancel** to select the PDA mode.

Selection a certain network (e.g. Network 1) and starts to register with that network. When the registration is completed, the screen will return to the main menu and the entire process of turning on the phone is completed.

Depending on the different settings, you may not need to go through the entire process to turn on the phone.

Selecting the Handset Operation Mode

After turning on the phone, the top left hand corner of the screen will show the icon (Phone mode) or icon (PDA mode), prompting you to select the operation mode:



Select **Phone Mode ON** and press **OK** to confirm your selection to go to the Phone Mode.

Select **Phone Mode OFF** and press **OK** to confirm your selection to go to the PDA Mode.

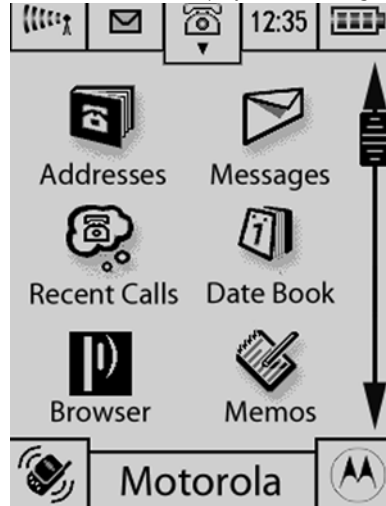
Select **Cancel** to dismiss the dialogue box and the current phone operation mode remains unchanged.

Turning OFF the phone

When the phone is ON, flip open the flip then press and hold the button for about 1 second before releasing.

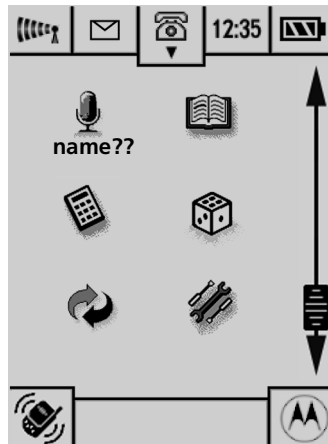

Operation Display icons

The Current Operation Display icons show various information on the phone, including:


Phone Mode Function









Shows that Line 1 is active;
[icon2] shown that Line 2 is active).

The icons indicate when the device is in phone mode, and also and the status of the lines. You can get into the phone mode by pressing on the icons to make a call.




Reception Level Indicator:

The  icon shows the radio frequency has NOT been activated and the handset is not able to make phone calls or send messages.





The  icon with the triangle shows that the phone is in the stage of roaming between the networks.

The , , ,  and  icons show the reception level, from the weakest to the strongest.

Current Messages Mode

 shows that there isn't any missed calls or unchecked messages;
flashing  and  show that there is a missed call and/or unchecked message.
Selecting the icon allows you to check on the missed call and message.

Battery Level Indicator

The , ,  and  icons show the battery level, from the weakest to the strongest.

Flashing , ,  or  show that the battery is charging.

Selecting the icon allows you to check on the current battery level.

The Function display icons include the following:

Vibration / Ring Alert

Shows "Emergency Call" when the phone can only make emergency calls.

 Pressing this icon will show information about the phone owner and phone book details.

Motorola A6188 is the latest wireless communications tool that combines the capability of a phone and a PDA. In fact, its way of operation is similar to that of a PDA as well—the LCD screen displays all the function icons and you can use the stylus provided to touch the screen and select the required functions, writing notes, drawing pictures and keying in information. It's made so simple that effectively, what you see on the screen is what you get! The screen will change in accordance to the different functions selected, giving you a wealth of information and guiding you as you go along with the operations.

The following are the most frequently used display and operational parts of a PDA:

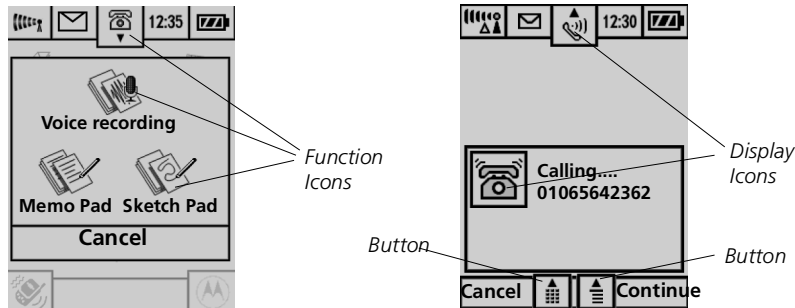
PDA Icons

There are 2 main types of icons namely, Function Icons and Display Icons.

Function Icon: Represents a certain function. Selecting a function icon will activate the function that it represents.

Display Icon: Purely for display purposes to make the screen easier to understand and user-







Button

Press a button to execute a certain function. The mostly common buttons are **Cancel** and **OK**, which are usually found at the bottom of a screen (at the Function Display or Dialogue Box). Selecting **OK** executes the function then returns to the previous menu; selecting **Cancel** aborts the function at the screen and merely returns to the previous menu.

Most Commonly Used Button—Function Selection Button

You can see this () button at the function displays of many screens. It can efficiently select the functions available at the current operation mode. Press () and a dialogue box with many different function selections will appear. You may activate a certain function by pressing the relevant function selection.

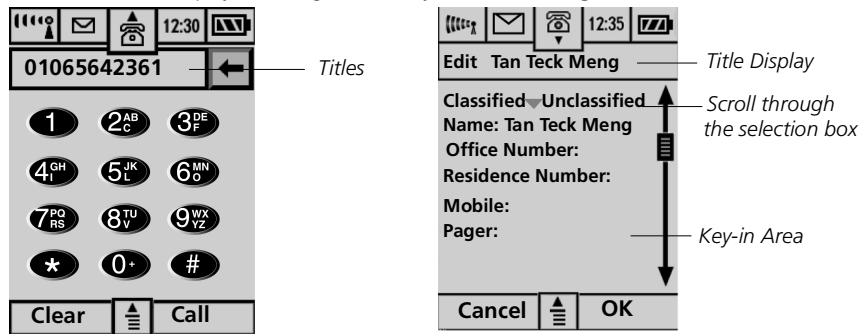
The function selections in a dialogue box change with the different handset operation modes. If you do not wish to select any functions, you may press () to dismiss the function dialogue box.

Title


Uses words or pictures to describe the functions. Certain displays only show the titles e.g. the narrow LCD display of a traditional analogue phone when making a phone call.

Key-in Area

You can use a stylus to key in words, figures or store pictures in the Key-in Area (there is a line at the bottom of the display to distinguish the key-in area). *Missing a sentence here.*

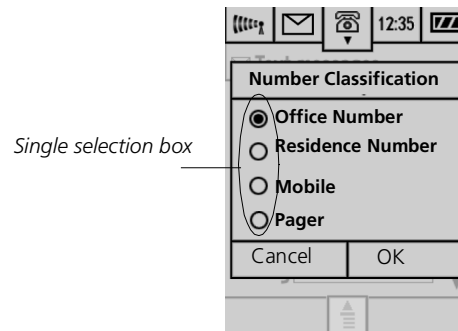


Scroll through the Selection Box

The current selection is shown on the selection box. For more selection options, press the small arrow () to scroll through the selection box. When you see a certain option that you wish to select, simply select the option to make it the current selection.

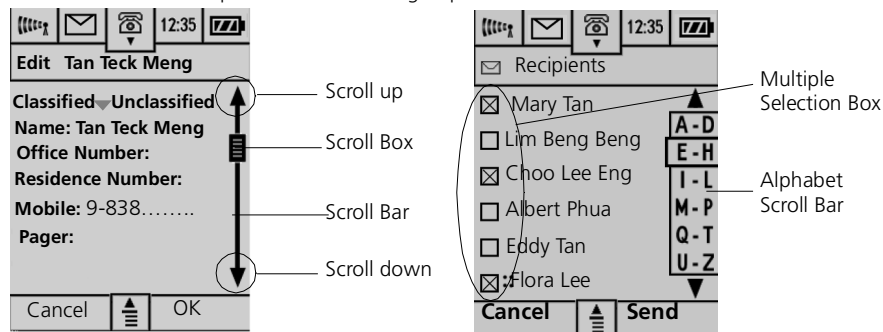
Single Selection Box

The current selection is being highlighted. If you wish to change the current selection, simply choose your selection and to replace the current selection. In this case, there is only ONE selection allowed.



Multiple Selection Box

The current selection(s) is marked with a cross. Simply press the selection that you wish to select and there can be multiple selections in this group.



Scroll Bar


When there is a lot of information that cannot be shown in the screen at the same time, you can either Scroll Up or Scroll Down for more information. The position of the Scroll Box shows the amount of current information relative to the total amount of information that is available.

As shown in the above diagram, you can use the following methods to scroll the screen:

- 1 By using touchscreen, dip the the up and down arrows to move up or down the screen one row at a time (to move a smaller area at one time).
- 2 Press the scroll bar between the Scroll Box and the Scroll Up or Scroll Down keys to move either up or down by one screen (to move a bigger area at one time).
- 3 Press and drag the Scroll Box to any position that you wish.

You may also use the scroll up and scroll down keys at the handset keypad to scroll the screen. With these keys, you can scroll up or down one screen at a time.

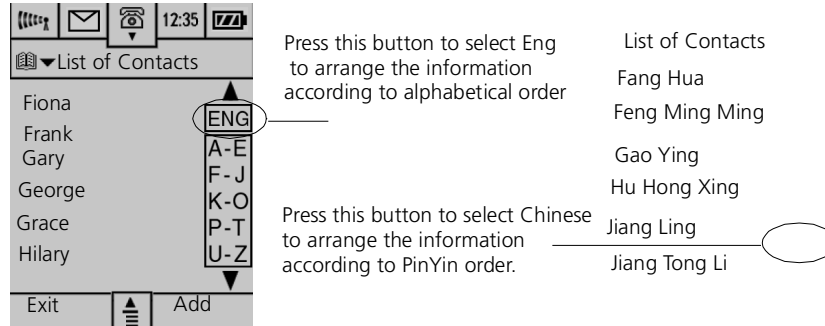
You may also use the scroll keys located at the left-hand side of the handset (Increase Volume / Move Forward or Decrease Volume / Move Backward) to scroll up or down one row at a time.

 The Rocker Switch located at the left-hand side of the handset can also be used to move forward or backward to select the Function Icon as well as move up and down

to select the various selections in the dialogue box. Press the switch to execute the highlighted icon function.

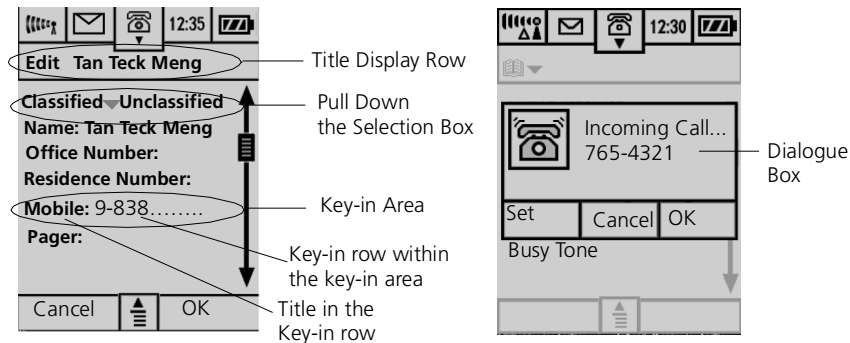
There is also an alphabet scroll bar that is used to display and arrange information (e.g. names in English or Chinese Pin Yin) in alphabetical order.

You may select either Eng or Chinese to arrange the information in alphabetical order (if you select Eng, it will not affect the order of the information in Chinese and vice versa). You may select the alphabet according to the grouping (e.g for alphabet F, select the grouping from **F--J**), the screen will then display the information under this grouping in an alphabetical order.



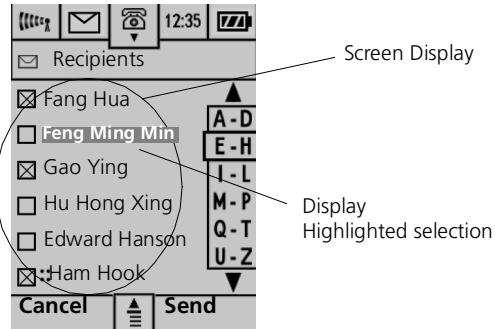

Function Display Row: is formed by many buttons and icons, usually at the last row of the screen display.



Dialogue Box: The screen will display a box that includes title, buttons, selection boxes etc to give user information as well as to seek instructions from user and execute these instructions

accordingly.

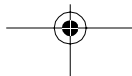
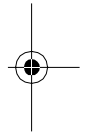

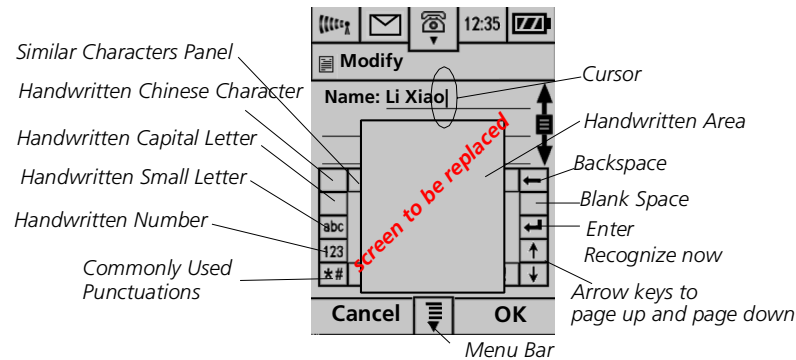
How to Key In Words

The *Motorola A6188* provides a few ways to efficiently key in your important information. To key in words, simply press the Key-In Area that is designated with a straight horizontal line and you can select the different methods to key in the words.

Handwritten Script Board:

One main method to key in information with a *Motorola A6188* is to use a handwritten board. It uses the **Motorola Wisdom Pen Handwriting Recognition** technology that recognizes handwritten characters and allows you to store information in either English or Chinese and even punctuates in a natural and efficient manner.

Press the Key-in Area and the following screen will appear for you to store or edit information:




The upper part of the screen shows the wordings that are to be edited, with the cursor showing the exact position where the keyed in words would appear. Use the stylus to touch the key-in area at a position where you wish to key in words. The cursor will appear at the point where the stylus touches the screen. (You can use this function to insert words within a sentence or delete some words.)

Before keying in any information, select and press **Chinese**, **ABC**, **abc** or **123** to choose the type of information you wish to key in.

Use the stylus to note down the information in the Handwritten Area. When you have finished writing and/or pause, it will automatically recognize the most similar character and place it at the cursor position. If the incorrect word is given, you can change it by selecting one of the characters in the Similar Characters Panel at the last cursor position. Press **OK** after finished writing in the Handwritten area to speed up the recognition.

You can make use of the function keys around the Key-In Area to add in the most commonly used punctuation marks, backspace, return, etc.

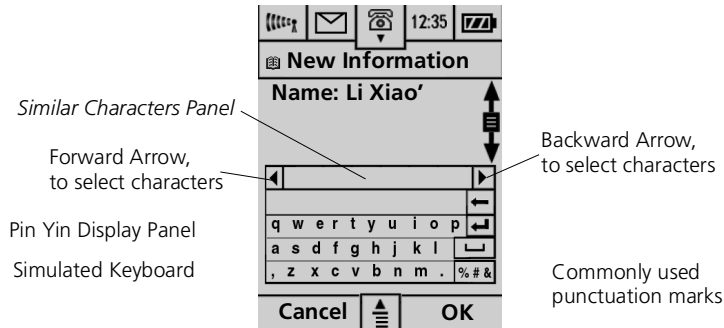
When you have finished keying in the information, press **OK** to reflect the changes and return to the previous menu. Press **Cancel** when you do not want to save the changes and return to the previous menu.

Press  to select other methods to key in information



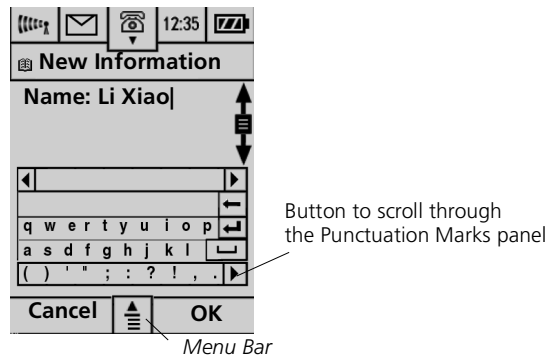
Pin Yin Keyboard:

After selecting the Pin Yin keyboard to key in information, a 'simulated' keyboard will appear at the screen (see diagram below) to allow you to key in Chinese characters using Pin Yin method.



Use the stylus to select the alphabet in the simulated keyboard to represent the corresponding Pin Yin of the Chinese character. The keyed in alphabets are displayed in the Pin Yin Display Panel while the corresponding Chinese characters appear in the Similar Characters Panel. Use the forward and backward keys to scroll through the Panel to show more Similar Characters. Then press and select the desired character to place it at the cursor position.

If you need to key in punctuation marks, press the **Commonly Used Punctuation Marks** button and the following screen will become:



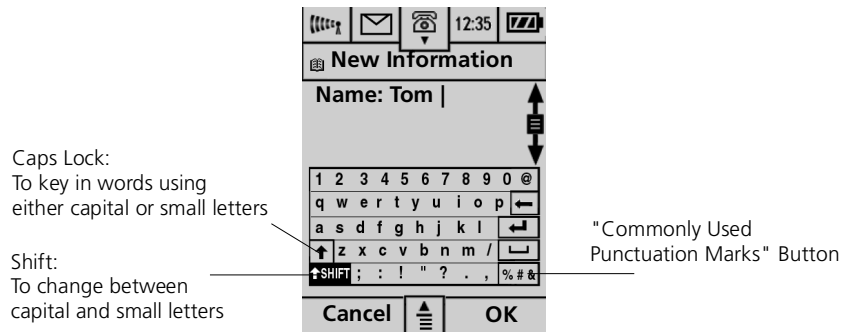
Once the desired punctuation mark is selected and keyed into the Key-In Area, you may press the down arrow at the lower right hand corner of the keyboard to enter the **Simulated Keyboard** again and may continue to enter more words.

Zhu Yin Keyboard:

Use Zhu Yin to key in Traditional Chinese characters, please refer to the earlier description on **Pin Yin Keyboard**.

English / Numbers Keyboard:

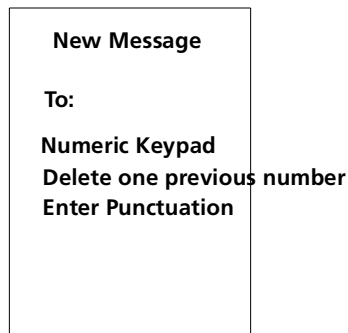
Once you select English Keyboard to key in your information (which can be English or Numbers), a **Simulated alphanumeric Keyboard** will appear in your screen (as shown in the below diagram):



Numeric Keypad:

Press on those Numeric buttons to enter the number in the Key-in area, then press **OK**.

If you need to input punctuations, press ****** so that the numeric keypad screen will change into punctuation screen. Press **123** again to return to numeric keypad screen.

Terms Used In this Guide

"Touch" or "Press":

Use the stylus or finger to "Press" a certain position of the screen (e.g. Button, Function Icon, Pull Down Selection Box, Single Selection Box, Multiple Selections Box etc) to execute a corresponding function that the icon or button represents. **Press** would also apply to using your fingers to press the device keypad (e.g. to turn on/ off a phone, recording button, rolling button etc.).

"Edit" or "Key In"

To perform the function of keying in or editing of information. After pressing the Key-in Area, you can either use Handwriting Recognition method or a **Simulated Keyboard** to key in the information. Press **OK** to confirm your selection in the Similar Character Panel and the character will be placed at the position of the cursor. You will then be returned to the previous menu and the characters entered will appear at the Key-in-Area.

"Select"

Use to operate the Pull Down Selection Box, Single Selection Box , Multiple Selection Box or Listings Display Selection etc.

Highlight

On a usual screen display, icons and text are usually black in color and the screen should have no color for the background. If a particular icon or text has been selected, the color will be inverted; that is the character or icon will be in white and the background will be black to show the highlighting.

Select Character

When reading a Short message, you can use your Stylus to press on a particular words , keep contact with the screen and slide. The words at the sliding path will then be having an inverted color. You may release the Stylus from the screen when destination has been reached.. The characters which are having the inverted color from the point your Stylus touches the screen until the point your Stylus releases the screen is considered to be selected.

As these operating terms are frequently used in this user guide, it is imperative that you have an understanding of these basic operation methods. With this basic understanding, you are free to explore the versatility and unparalleled benefits of your advanced *Motorola A6188*!

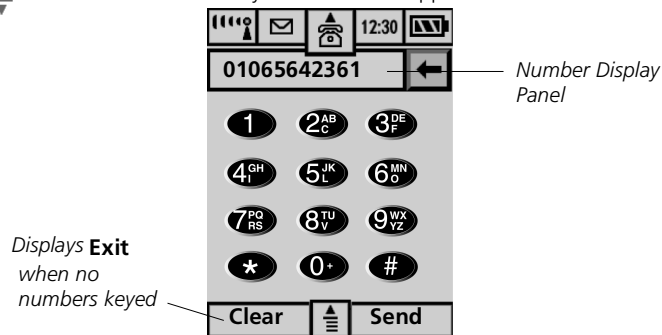
Phone Functions

The Phone mode is only operational in areas where the network/service is available.

Making a Phone Call

[The Motorola A6188 is having a large number of adress book functionality and is able to record the last 20 calls (including missed calls, outgoing calls and received calls). It is suggested that you make use of this function to increase the efficiency of your communications. Please note that you may also use the pad of your touch screen to dial a phone number.]

- 1 Press at the main menu and your screen will appear as follows:



- 2 Press the number that you wish to call and the number will appear at the Number Display Panel. Press if you wish to delete the last digit. Press **Clear** to clear the entire phone number at the display panel.
- 3 Press **Send** to make a phone call by dialing the number at the display panel. Press **End** to end a call or just close the phone flip to hang up the phone.

To make International Direct Dial (IDD) calls or call direct extensions, see the In-Call Menu functions.

Press or press button to return to the main menu.

If there is no number in the Number Display Panel, press "Redial" to redial the last dialed number.

To make phone calls from the Adress Book, see "Using the Address Book to Call and Send Messages."

To dial a number from a SMS message, see "Retrieving a Phone Number from a Message".

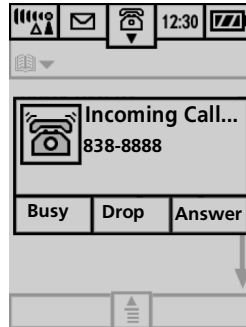
GSM Emergency Phone Call

The worldwide GSM standard provides a single, uniform number, 112, to dial in cases of an emergency. You will be able to make an emergency call provided your phone is in an area covered by the GSM network.

Receiving a Phone Call

To receive a phone call, your phone must be switched on. You must also be in an area where there is network coverage and your All Call Diversion and Call Barring settings should not be set to divert or bar incoming calls.

When there is an incoming call, your phone will ring (or vibrate) and the screen will display:



Press **OK** to answer the call. When the call is finished, press **End** to end the call or simply close the clip to hang the phone.

Press **Drop** to reject a call with an announcement or routing the call to diverting number.

Press **Busy** to reject a call with a busy tone.

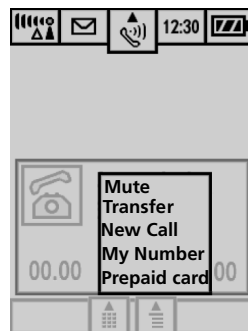
If you pre-set the "Key Answer Only" to OFF, the call will be answered upon opening the flip. If the flip is currently open, press the Smart Button to answer the call.

If the phone flip is opened, you can then press the Rocket switch to answer the call.

When in the Phone mode, the Function status will change according to the current call state.

- Not dialing or not during a phone call
- Dialing or in use
- Call Waiting/ Call on hold


Press and the Function Display Box will appear (see diagram below). You can choose the function by pressing the desired function in the box. The functions will change in accordance with the current call state.



If you do not wish to select the function, press to dismiss the Function Display Box.

Off-Connection Functions (Before Connection and During dialing Functions)

Some services will only be available provided that you have subscribed them from your Cellular Service Provider.


Press  and you could select the following options, including:

Redial: Automatically redials the last number

Show ID: This option allows you to make a call without the remote receiver getting information of your phone number.

Hide ID: This option allows you to make a call without the remote receiver getting information of your phone number.

Switch to Line 2: SIM card can have 2 numbers to be used. They are Line 1 and Line 2. This option is used to when choosing the first number or the second number to be used for dialing.

 *This option will only be available provided that it is supported by your Cellular Service Provider and that you have subscribed it from your service provider.*

International Direct Dialing Call

This allows you to call from any country without knowing the local international access code. Simply add the international dialing prefix +, followed by the country code and the phone number to make an international call.

Inserting Pauses for Dialing Extensions or Voice Message Center

To insert a three-second pause character in a phone number:

At the position where the pause is reached, the phone will wait for 3 seconds before it proceed to dial the rest of the dialling string. However, the first pause in the dialling string is an exception. When the pause is reached, the phone will wait until the call is answered. This is used for example, if after the phone number 765-4321, you wish to insert a pause, then dial 7227 so that you will be transferred directly to the extension 7227 of the phone number 765-4321.

Pause--A Working Example:


If you have a tone-based voicemail system on 555-8888 with a mailbox number of 1111 and password of 2222. Then you may dial the following number:

555-8888 [xx] 1111 [xx] 2222 OK

My Number: To display your own phone number.



Prepaid Card: Show the total remaining amount the card is having. The rate depends on the rate preset in the device.


During Conversation Functions

 *Some services will only be available provided that you have subscribed them from your Cellular Service Provider and if the Cellular Service Provider is having this service.*

Press **End** to stop the dialing and end the call.

Press **Hold** to put the call on hold

Press  to put the call on hold and change into the Dial Pad (the Function Icon will show , indicating that the call has been put on hold). You may then dial another number.

Press  to select the following options:

Mute

Turns Mute On or Off.

This function temporarily turns the microphone off during a phone call. Reselect this option to resume your conversation.

Transfer

This option transfers a call to another telephone.

New Call

This function allows you to make a new call.

Shows the phone number of the handset

Pre-Paid Card

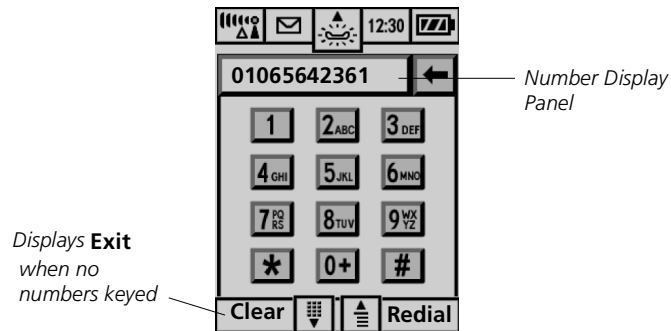

Hold Call and Dial another Number

During an active call:

- 1 Press and the screen will show:

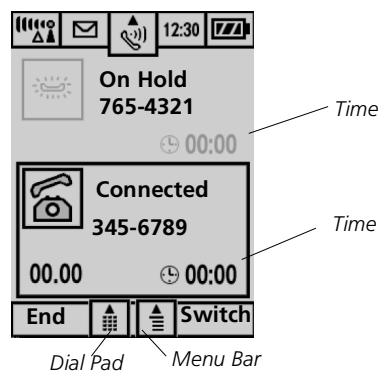

Switch Call

This service will only be available provided that you have subscribed it from your Cellular Service Provider and if the Cellular Service Provider is having this service.

When holding an active call, if you have successfully dialed another phone number, the screen will show:



Press **Switch** to switch between the active call and the call that is on hold.

Press **End** to continue with the active call.

Transfer Call

Transfers a call to another telephone. .

This service will only be available provided that you have subscribed it from your service provider and if the Cellular Service Provider is having this service.

To transfer an active call (only one call), please follow the steps below:

- 1 Press and then press Transfer.
- 2 Press the number that you wish to call and the number will appear at the Number Display Panel. Press if you wish to delete the last digit. Press **Clear** to clear the entire phone number at the display panel.
- 3 Press **Trfer** to transfer the call.
- 4 Press and the call will not be transferred.



Number Display Panel

If you have an active call and a call on hold, to transfer a call:

Press and then press **Trfer**. When the call is transferred, it will automatically end your call. The earlier call which you have previously put on hold is now active.

Making a Conference Call

This service will only be available provided that you have subscribed it from your Cellular Service Provider and if the Cellular Service Provider is having this service.

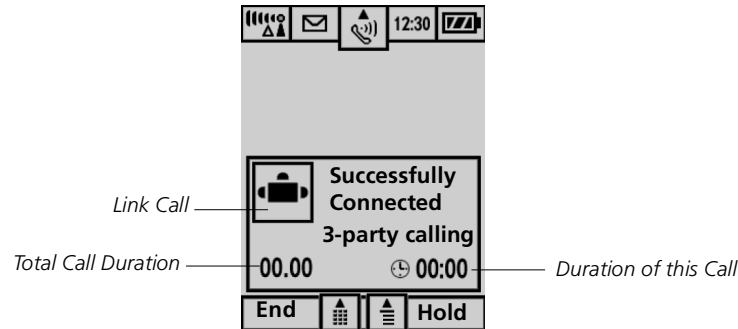
This option joins the active call with a hold call. With conference call, you can have a conference with up to five other telephones. At any time during your call, you can add, disconnect or separate individuals from the Conference Call.

Initiating a Conference Call

To initiate a conference call, you should:

- 1 Firstly, dial one party of the conference call;
- 2 Then, place this call on hold and dial another phone number. You will then have one active call and one call on hold.
- 3 Press to enter the in-call menu and select **Link Call**. Yourself, the currently active call and the call on hold will then join into one conference call. The screen will show the

number of parties in the conference call.



Adding a New Call to the Conference Call

While in a conference call, you can add new call by:

- 1 placing another number for dialing. Please refer Dialing Phone Call section.
- 2 Or by answering a call waiting call.

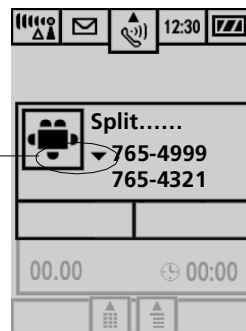

Address Book

Personal Contact Information

The Address Book stores and records important contact details and information including names, addresses, telephone numbers, fax numbers, pager numbers, important dates etc. Once stored, a number can be quickly retrieved and dialed plus you can even use the information to send faxes and e-mails.

The category of contact details helps you to organize and retrieve your information efficiently. You can classify your contacts according to your communication needs. It enables you to store important information effectively and retrieve information efficiently. The *Motorola A6188* provides some basic information categories:

All Contacts: To list the contacts under all categories


Business: Business contacts

Personal : Personal contacts

Owner: Information about yourself which is required for surfing the internet.

SIM Card: the contacts information saved in the SIM card (indicated by showing (a) before the family name).

Fixed Dialing: This option allows you to switch Fixed Dialing On or Off and to enter or change entries in the Fixed Dial list. The feature allows you to limit use (typically third-party use) of your phone to a predefined list of telephone numbers. See "Call Barring" Under Systems Setup.

 *This option will only be available provided that you have subscribed it from your Cellular Service Provider.*


Unfiled: Contacts that are not classified at the moment. Default category setting for all new contacts.

In addition to the above categories, you can also add in your own categories to allow you to manage your information efficiently and tailor existing categories to meet your communication needs.


Unless you classify the contacts under Phone Memory or SIM Card Memory, all other contacts information will be stored under the Phone Memory. Depending on the type of SIM card and the services that you subscribe, most SIM cards allow only basic contacts information to be stored (usually a name and a phone number under each contact).

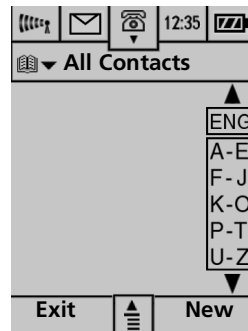
On the other hand, the Phone Memory can store a wealth of information. When you change your cellular device, the information stored in the SIM Card Memory (of the original SIM card) is transferable while the information stored in the Phone Memory remains with the original device.

Grouping

You can use grouping to group relevant contacts in a group (colleagues, members of the same club etc) to facilitate the sending of the same information to the group. A  icon before the group listing indicates that the contacts listed below are in the same group.

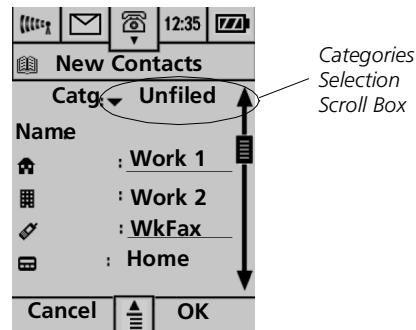

Messages

The GSM device besides being used for normal voice calls, possesses the capability of sending and receiving messages to and from other devices. The *Motorola A6188* with its extra large touch display and icons provide the user with the ease of operation in sending and receiving messages, and many other features.

At the Main menu press  to enter the Message Center display:



Here, you can manage various types of messages. In the display shown above, each row is known as a folder. Selecting any of them will enable you to enter a different display in which you can manage your messages differently. The number behind the folder indicates the current number of messages in that particular folder. The numbers in brackets indicate new and unread messages.

Every folder has different functions and each operation is different too. The functions are explained below:

Voice Mail: When you are unable to attend to the incoming call, the incoming call will be automatically directed to the voicemail number to enable the other party to leave you a voicemail which you can retrieve later.

 **Voicemail requires the Cellular Service Provider to support the service and that you have already subscribed the service.**


Text Msgs: Send and Receive messages

 New Messages (unread message)

 Old Messages

 **SMS messaging requires the Cellular Service Provider to support the service and that you have already subscribed the service.**

Info Service: These are general messages such as weather forecasts or stock market information broadcasted to your device.

 **Info Service messaging requires the Cellular Service Provider to support the service and that you have already subscribed the service.**

Quick Text: When editing messages, you can use the built-in library of (commonly used phrases) Quick Text

SIM card: SMS messages stored in your SIM card. The messages can be moved to another folder if necessary

Draft: Folder to Store unfinished messages.

Sent Messages: On successful sending of a message, a copy of it will be stored in this folder. Icons - to show already sent message.

Outbox: Messages waiting to be sent will be stored in this folder. You can still edit the messages before sending.


Icons - to show yet sent message

Icons - not sent but will be set to sent after the time delay

Surfing The Internet

Through the WAP Browser, you can connect to the Internet to get all your required information. The Motorola A6188's enlarged touch screen allows you to surf the Net with much more convenience.


■ The option of surfing Internet depends on the availability of service from the Cellular Service Provider and whether you have subscribed the Service. Please check with your Cellular Service Provider with regards to WAP (Wireless Application Protocol) configurations.

In order to connect to the Internet using WAP, you will need:

- 1 Subscribe to a WAP service.
- 2 Connect WAP service to your device.
- 3 Use a WAP Browser to get connected to Internet.

You need to subscribe to an Internet access through an Internet Cellular Service Provider (or ISP).

WAP Setup

 Your Internet Cellular Service Provider may help you to setup your WAP when you subscribe their service.

If you need to manually setup the Internet configuration, you will need to setup the DNS (Domain Name Service) address and the IP address. The IP (Internet Protocol) address connects your phone to Internet while the DNS address relays all incoming data and outgoing request, thus allows you to surf the Internet.

You need to know the following: (This information should be obtained from ISP upon your initial subscription):

Types of DNS address:

DNS address provides the link from phone to Internet. Types of service areas can be differentiated into data routing and dual short message.

IP address:

IP address is made up of a set of four numbers, Example --- 123.456.789.123

Port Number:

Connection to the Internet via a port number.

Internet dial-in number:

Your ISP will provide you with a dial-in number, which allows your device to be connected to the Internet

Username:

Your ISP will provide you with a log-in username.

Password:

The password helps to prevent unauthorized access to the Internet. This password is provided by your ISP and can be subsequently changed.

Modem Speed:

There is a selection of various speed: 2400bps, 4800bps, 9600bps or 14400bps; among them, GSM Network's standard speed is 9600bps.

Inactive Time:

A timer that tracks the connection time. Once connected to the Internet, and if there are no activities within the preset duration, the device will be automatically disconnected. The default

time delay is 600 seconds while the longest time delay is 1000 seconds.

Modem Types:

By Modem or ISDN.

Types of connection:

To use proxy or not, depends on the ISP.

In your Phonebook, your personal contact details should include your hand phone number. The ISP will use this number as the Main account number. If the number is not listed in your Address Book, please remember to input your hand phone number.

See details in Phonebook—Personal contact details—adding contact details.

The Motorola A6188 can input up to 3 DNS addresses (In this way, whenever a DNS address is down, the next DNS address in line will be used so as not to interrupt the Internet connection).

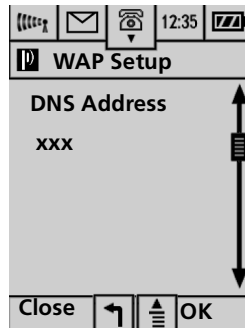

Systems Setup

Setups, Selections and Values

The setup of a systems determines how to execute the various functions. When the device is launched to the market from the factory, the system is setup such that you can execute various functions simply by inserting a SIM Card. However, to satisfy more diverse communications needs, you can re-define and tailor the systems setup to meet your sophisticated communication requirements.

There are ten main types of systems setup, including:

- Security
- Memory Usage
- Initial Setup
- Phone Setup
- Sounds & Alerts
- Display Setup
- Messaging Setup
- Network Setup
- Browser Setup
- Power Management

Each type of setup also entails a few selections where you can choose to select the setup and input the various setup value (See Systems Setup, Setup Selections and Setup Value at the later part of this section). These different settings control the function of a phone.

In addition, some setup selections are also related to the various functions of a phone. They do not come under Systems Setup, but are included in the related functions, e.g.:

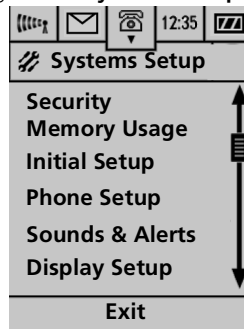

Setup Capabilities

Press  at the main menu to go to the **Systems Setup** Display:




You can use the scroll bar to scroll up or down the screen to look for the type of setup that you want to change.

Press **Exit** to return to the main Menu display.

The following section covers the various Setups, the Setup Selections, the Setup Values and the Default Settings of the various Setup selections.

Security Features

You can execute the functions of the Security Settings by setting up the PIN and various selections to prevent the use of the phone by unauthorized users and to restrict the use of certain phone functions.

Press  at the main menu to enter the **Systems Setup** menu. Select **Security Features** and go to the **Security Setup** display:



The Phone Lock function protects your phone from being used by unauthorized users as you need a PIN to unlock your phone before using it.

The PIN is a 4-digit number. The default manufacturer's setting for PIN is 1234 but you can change the PIN for security purposes.

Lock Phone Now

Press **Lock Phone Now** and you can lock the phone immediately, preventing it from being used. The phone can only be unlock by keying in the right phone unlock code. After pressing this selection, the screen will appear as follows:



Key in the Unlock code and then press **Enter**

If the wrong code is keyed in, the screen will show **Invalid Code, please try again.**

If the correct code is inputted, the screen will show **Phone Locked**. The following screen will

appear:



***Menu Bar and Send Button gray out???

Key in your Code: you can use the number pad to key in your Code and press Enter to unlock the phone. After key in the number, the send button change back to normal but the menu bar still gray out

Press delete the last digit.

When the phone is locked, you can still make GSM emergency phone calls by keying in "112" and press **Send** to make the call. When the phone is dialing (but not connected), you can press **End** to stop the dialing and end the call.

Auto Lock

You can setup the phone such that Auto Lock will be activated every time you turn on the phone. You can choose to either turn the **Auto Lock ON** or **OFF**.

When the Security setup menu shows that Auto Lock is ON (or Auto Lock is OFF), press **Auto Lock**, key in your Phone Unlock Code and press **Enter**. When the Phone Unlock Code is correct, you can change the Auto Lock to OFF (or Auto Lock is ON) and return to the Security Features menu. Press **Cancel** to return to the previous menu without changing the settings.

Fixed Dialing

Fixed Dialing allows you to limit use (typically third-party use) of your phone to a predefined list of telephone numbers of, if you wish, to a list of country codes, area codes, or other prefixes of your choice.

The availability of the Fixed Dialing function depends on the type of SIM Card.

When the Security Features menu shows that **Fixed Dialing** is **ON** (or Fixed Dialing is **OFF**), press **Fixed Dialing**, key in your SIM PIN and press **OK**. When the PIN is correct, you can change the Fixed Dialing to OFF (or Fixed Dialing is ON) and return to the Security setup menu. Press **Cancel** to return to the previous menu without changing the settings.

SIM Request

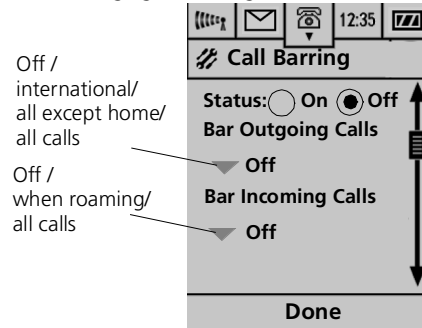
PIN is the secret code of the SIM Card. You can pre-set a PIN to prevent unauthorized users from using your SIM Card. You can select this function as **ON** or **OFF**. If you select the function as ON, you have to key in your PIN every time you turn on the phone, failing which you will be unable to use the phone.

When the Security setup menu shows that **SIM Request** is **ON** (or SIM Request is **OFF**), press **SIM Request**, key in your PIN and press **Enter**. When the PIN is correct, you can change the PIN Requirements to OFF (or SIM Request is ON) and return to the Security setup menu. Press **Cancel** to return to the previous menu without changing the settings.

Call Barring

Call Barring is a network feature which can be used to selectively bar outgoing and incoming calls.

At the Security Features menu, press **Call Barring** and Press **Done** to return to the Security setup menu without changing the settings.



You can select the mode of Call Barring as **ON** or **OFF**.

Press the **Bar Outgoing Calls** to select the call barring options.

International Calls: When selected, this option will bar outgoing international calls

All Except Home: When selected, this option will bar outgoing international calls, except those to your home country.

All Calls: When selected, this option will bar all outgoing calls, except GSM emergency calls.

Off: When selected, this option will disable all call barring for outgoing calls.

Press the **Bar Incoming Calls** to select the call barring options.

when Roaming: When selected, this option will bar incoming calls when you are roaming between networks.

All Calls: When selected, this option will bar all incoming calls

Off: When selected, this option will disable all call barring for incoming calls.

Roaming between the networks refers to roaming between the different GSM networks, not necessarily in terms of roaming in different regions or countries. For example, regardless of whether a China Telecom subscriber is in Beijing or XiAn, as long as he is still using the China Telecom network (and not other networks), he is NOT considered as roaming between networks.

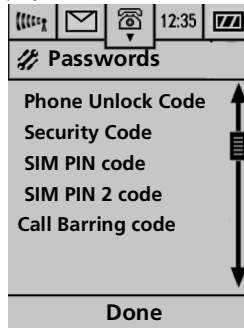
Press **Done** to change the settings and return to the Security setup menu.

Passwords: allows you to change your PIN

Press **Passwords** and the PIN Display menu will show:



Press **Done** to return to the Security setup menu. Press a particular PIN selection to edit and change the PIN. For example, changing the Phone Unlock Code in this case:



 To change the SIM card PIN code, the PIN Requirements must be set to **ON** and you must enter the old PIN code before you can proceed.

When you keyed in the wrong PIN code, the screen will show **Invalid PIN code, 2 more tries**. If you keyed in the wrong PIN again, the screen will prompt **Invalid PIN code, 1 last try**. If the PIN number is entered incorrectly 3 times in a row, your SIM card will automatically lock-up and the Blocked message will be displayed.

If your SIM card is lock-up, and you receive the Blocked message, you will need to enter a PIN Unblock (PUK) code and key sequence before you can use the phone. You will need to contact your service provider (SingTel Mobile, M1, etc.) for the PUK code to unlock the SIM card.

⚠ If the PUK code is entered incorrectly 10 times in a row, your SIM card will become permanently blocked.

SIM Card Unlock Screen:

Press **PDAMode** selects and activates the PDA mode. In this mode, the device is not able to make any calls (not in phone mode) and the SIM card remains locked.

At the PIN code: Use the number pad to enter the PIN code. Press to delete the last digit. Press **Enter** and the screen will prompt you to enter the SIM card PIN code. Press **OK** and go to the PUK screen as follows:



At the PIN code: Use the number pad to enter the PIN code. Press to delete the last digit. Press **OK**. If the PIN code and the earlier PIN are entered correctly, the SIM card will be unlocked.

Device Memory Usage Status


Various device functions like address book, messages Center, (activities planner)???, Date Book, Note Pad, Ink Pad, etc use the main memory of the device, while the SIM Card phone book and short message folder use the memory of the SIM Card. When a lot of information has been stored and the main memory is going to be full, the screen will show:

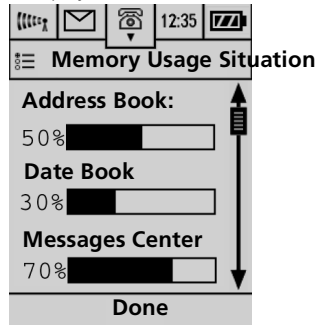

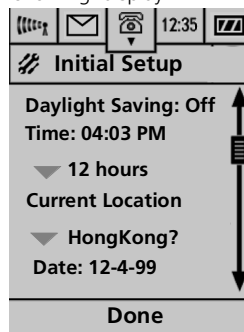

Initial Setup

You can use the initial setup to set the clock, date, language, details of the phone owner and other basic information. Press  at the main menu to go to the **Systems Setup** display, then select **Initial Setup** to enter the following display:



You can use the scroll bar to scroll up or down the screen to check the various setup selections and the setup value.

Press **Done** and return to the **Systems Setup** display.

Daylight Saving: you can choose to turn the Daylight Saving mode **On** or **Off**.

At the Initial Setup display,

when it shows Daylight Saving On, select Daylight Saving mode to turn it Off.

when it shows Daylight Saving Off, select Daylight Saving mode to turn it On.

Clock Settings: you can use this to adjust the time of the phone.

Select **Time** at the Initial Setup screen, a clock settings dialogue box will appear, prompting you

to adjust the time. (See the Clock Settings under Diary)

Time Format

At the Initial Setup display, you can select either the 24 hours or 12 hours selection box to set up the time format.

Date Settings: you can use the date settings to set the date.

Select Date at the Initial Setup screen, the date setting dialogue box will appear, prompting you to set the date. (See Date Settings under Calendar).

Date Format

At the Initial Setup display, press the Date Format selection box to select the date format.

yyyy-mm-dd (Year-Month-Day)

mm-dd-yyyy (Month-Day-yr)

dd-mm-yyyy (Day-Month-yr)

Language Selection: used to change the language for display messages. When you select a language, all further display prompts and help messages will be in the selected language.

At the Initial Setup display, press the **Language Selection** box and select a language option from the single selection box. Selection options include:

English

Simplified Chinese

Traditional Chinese

Automatic

(Chinese input)

Simplified

Traditional



Press **OK** to confirm your choice and the chosen language will be displayed. Press **Cancel** to abort changing the language currently being used.

Place (Current Location)

At the Initial Setup screen, press the Current Location selection box and a dialogue box will appear, prompting you to select a city.

Personalization


At the Initial Setup screen, press personalization to go to the NewPerson / Edit:Owner display to search and edit various information about the phone owner. See Search / Edit Contacts Information under the Address Book.

 Press  icon at the main menu to display the phone owner's properties.

Startup Greetings: the greeting that will be shown when you turn on the phone.

At the Initial Setup display, press Startup Greetings and enter the required greeting at the key-in area. Press OK to confirm the greeting that you have just entered and the greeting will be shown every time you just turn on the phone.


Master Reset

 **This option should be used with caution.**

This option is used to restore certain phone options to their original settings.

Select **Master Reset** at the Initial Setup display. The screen will prompt you to enter the security code. If the correct security code is entered, the dialogue box will show "**Reset Settings to Factory?**" Press **OK** to return to default settings and press **Cancel** to abort operation.

Master Clear

 **This option should be used with extreme caution.**

Besides performing the same operations as Master Reset, the Master Clear will also clear the


Phone Book entries from phone memory (not from SIM memory).

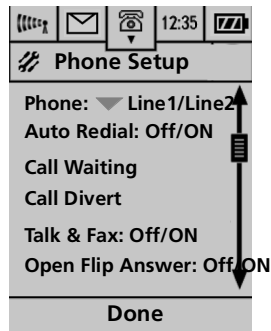
Select **Master Clear** at the Initial Setup screen. The screen will prompt you to enter the security code. If the correct security code is entered, the dialogue box will show **Clear all Data from Phone?** Press **OK** to execute the operation and press **Cancel** to abort the operation.

Phone Setup


This setup determines the performance of the phone during a phone call.

Press  at the main menu to go to the **Systems Setup** display. Select Phone Setup to enter the Phone Setup display as follows:



Phone Selection for Phone Line

A SIM Card carries two lines and this option allows you to switch between Line 1 and Line 2. Press and Scroll down the selection box to select a line (usually Line 1 is being used).

 *Availability depends on the type and settings of the SIM card, and/or your subscription to this feature.*

Auto Redial

You can select to turn this option on or off. If your call attempt does not succeed, After few seconds will automatic redial the phone number.

when it shows Auto Redial On, select Auto Redial to turn it Off.

when it shows Auto Redial Off, select Auto Redial to turn it On.

Flip Answer

when it shows Flip Answer On, select Flip Answer to turn it Off.

when it shows Flip Answer Off, select Flip Answer to turn it On.

Auto Answer

Sets up the phone such that incoming call will be automatically answered upon the second ring.

when it shows Auto Answer On, select Auto Answer to turn it Off.

when it shows Auto Answer Off, select Auto Answer to turn it On.

My Number

You can enter the names and telephone numbers of Line 1 and Line 2.

Talk & Fax

This is a network feature that allows you to speak and then send or receive a fax during the course of a single call. ***when I select “Talk & Fax” ON , the Phone can not receive or answer

any call.

when it shows Talk & Fax On, select Talk & Fax to turn it Off.

when it shows Talk & Fax Off, select Talk & Fax to turn it On.

Call Waiting


[Note!] This is an option that requires the network support.

You can set it on or off such that you can place an active call on hold and accept an incoming call or start a second call (and not set busy tone).

when it shows Call Waiting On, select Call Waiting and the phone will register with the network (the screen will show " Please wait...") to turn it Off and press **OK**.

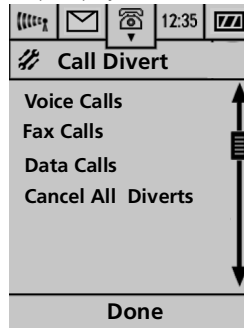
when it shows Call Waiting Off, select Call Waiting and the phone will register with the network (the screen will show " Please wait...") to turn it On and press **OK**.

Call Divert

 *Call Divert requires network support.*

If your phone is unavailable or you do not wish to receive calls, incoming calls can be diverted to other phone numbers (or fax numbers).

Select **Call Divert** at the Phone Setup display and the Call Divert display will appear as follows:



Press **Cancel All** Diverts to cancel the diversion of incoming calls.

Press Voice Calls, Fax Calls or Data Calls. After registering with the network, you can select the various diverting options. For example, in the case of diverting Voice Calls:

Divert All Voice Calls

At Call Diverting title, press All Voice Calls. This option has two settings, On or Off.

If you change the setting to On and press key-in area of To:, you will be asked to enter a diversion phone number using the digit keypad. Press **OK** to confirm the key-in number.

Press **OK** and all incoming calls will be diverted to the keyed in phone number.

Detailed Divert

This option allows you to divert voice calls to different numbers, depending on the different status of your phone.

If Busy

Diverts incoming calls when your phone is busy

If Not Reachable

Diverts incoming calls when you are not in the network coverage area.

If No Answer

Diverts incoming calls if you do not answer the call.

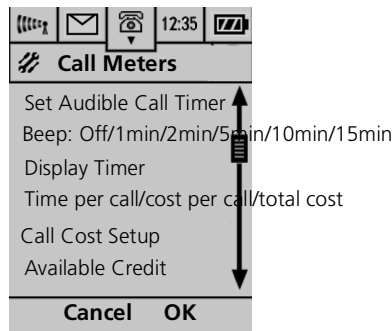

After you have set up the diversion, press **OK** to return to the Phone Setup menu.

Call Cost Setup

This option requires network support provided by the service operators.

At the Phone Setup menu, select **Call Charges Settings**. The screen will prompt you to enter a PIN2. If the correct PIN is entered, you will go to the Call Charges settings to do the following settings:

Total Call Charges

Two setting under this option: On or Off to determine whether to limit Total Call Charges. You can also choose to **Set Total Charge Limit** by entering the Charge Limit amount in the key-in area.

Set Charge Type

This option defines whether charge information is displayed as either phone time units or currency.

Currency

Press **Currency** (if you have selected phone units, the currency scroll box will become grey colour, indicating that it is not in use) and select the type of currency that you want.

Charges

Defines the call charges per time unit

Reset Total Charge Limit

Select this option and press **OK** to confirm your selection. You will then return to the Call Meters screen, with a new / reset total charge limit.

Available Credits



Select this option displays the remaining credits of a pre-paid telephone call.

Total Call Charges

Displays the costs of all your chargeable calls.

Lifetime Timer


This option is used to display the total time of all calls made on your phone.

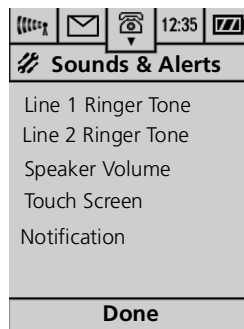

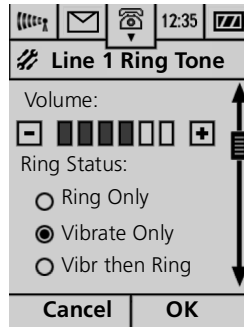

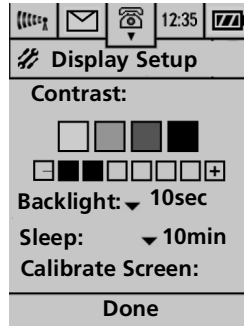
Mark the ☐ checkboxes ☒ for *Text Message*, *Voicemail*, *Message Services* and *Appointment* to

enable the Alarm Sound for the various options.



Press on the **Alarm Type** pull-down box to select between 13 different types of ringing tones. After you have finished the setup, press on **OK** to return to the Ring and Tone display to save the changes.

Display Settings

In the Main Menu, press  to enter the **System Setting** display and press on **Display Setting** to enter the display.



In the Display Setting display, there are four boxes underneath the **Contrast** setting to select between the 4 different contrast levels.

Press on  or  to decrease or increase the brightness.

In the **Display Setup** display, press the **Backlight** delay pull-down box to set the elapsed time interval before the background light goes off during period of inactivity:

- 10 second
- 20 second
- 30 second
- 60 second

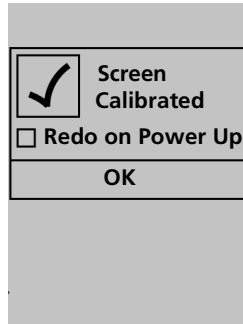
In the **Display Setup** display, press the **Sleep** mode pull-down box to set the elapsed time interval before the screen goes into sleep mode: (which will resume on any activity)

- 1 min
- 2 min
- 5 min

When the Stylus Pen is not pointing accurately on the display, it is time to calibrate it. In the Display **Display Setup** display, you can press on **Calibrate Screen** to enter the following display:



Follow the instructions (touch the center of the circle) and after a few tries, the following display will appear:



If the **Redo On Power Up** checkbox is marked, the above *Calibrate Screen* display will appear first when the power is turn on.

Network Setting

In order to use the hand phone, it must be registered in either a GSM900 or GSM1800 band network or a GSM900/GSM1800 dual-band network.

Generally, the phone will automatically search for a network that it can register and use.

The phone will follow this sequence in registering a network:


- The network that is incorporated into the SIM card

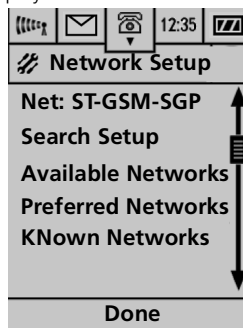
- The preferred network list

- The network that is above specific service strength

- The stronger network

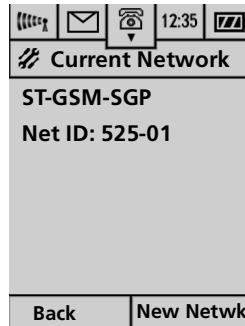
The phone will not search for a network that is barred by the SIM card

In the Main Menu, press  to enter the **System Setting** display and then press on **Network Setup** to enter the display:



The current network is shown in the Network Setting. Press on **Net:** and the following dialogue

box will appear:



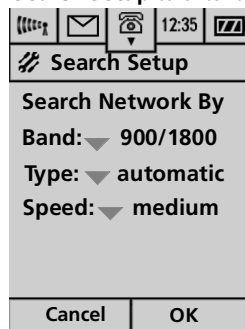
After viewing the current network details, you can press on **Back** to return to the Network Setting display.

Press on **Search Setup** and the display will show **Searching For Network...** .If a network is found, the display will show **Registering Network...** .If no network is found, the display will show **No Network Found**.

Network Search Setting

This setting allows you to specify how the phone searches and registers the network and also the number of networks it can search for.

In the **Network Setup**, press on **Search Setup** to enter the display:



Network Band

Network band allows you to specify the preferred network band. A change of the network band might cause a failure in network search. Please use a suitable network band. See...[?]

In the Network Search Setup display, select the **Band** pull-down box to select between:

- 900 MHz,
- 1800 MHz or
- 900/1800 MHz band.

Network Type

Lets you specify the ways the phone search and register a network.

In the Network **Search Setup** display, select the **Type** pull-down box to select between:

- Automatic or
- Manual Search.

In the **Automatic** Search method, the phone will follow the sequence listed above in its attempt to register a network. If it is successful, the name of the network will appear on the status bar at

the bottom of the display and it awaits confirmation. If it is unable to locate a network and after a certain time (the duration is dependent on the number of networks it searches for), it will repeat the search process.

In the **Manual** Search method, a network sequence list will appear (see *Available Network*). Use the scroll bar to select the network that you want. Press on **OK** to register the network. If the registration is successful, the name of the network will appear on the status bar at the bottom of the screen and it awaits confirmation. If it is unable to locate the network and after a certain time (the duration is dependent on the number of networks it searches for), it will list the network sequence again.

Search Speed

This function decides when the network registration is unsuccessful, how much time should lapse before it tries to register again.

In the Network **Search Setup** display, select the **Speed** pull-down box to select:

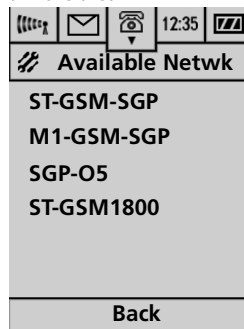

- Medium,
- Fast or
- Continuous.

 *Fast and Continuous Search Speed drain the battery power.*

Available Networks

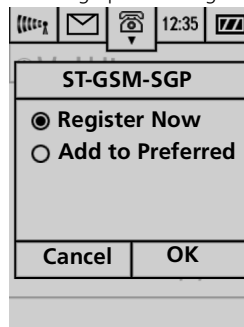
Show the networks that are present in the area, which it can attempt to register.

In the Network Setup display, you can press on **Available Networks** to enter the display which lists the networks that are present in the area:



If listed networks are more than 6, use the scroll bar to view the available networks in the area. Press on **Back** to return to the Network Setting display.

Select the network that you want to bring up the dialogue box:

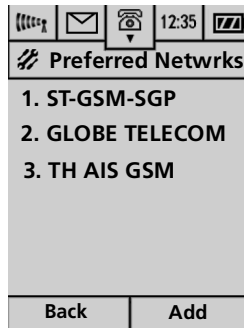

Accessories Setting

Accessories Setting for Car Phone and Headset (Hands-Free Set).

In the Main menu, press  to enter the **System Setting** display. Press on **Accessories Setting** to enter the display.

In the **Car Phone** setting, you can select:

Auto Pick Up: automatically pick up incoming calls.

Auto Hands-Free: automatically switch to hands-free function.

Silent Car Stereo: cars stereo volume automatically goes off on any incoming calls. Automatically goes on again when call is over.

When the phone is attached to the car phone accessory set, select **Auto Shutdown Delay** to set the elapsed time interval to automatically shutdown the phone when it is not being used:

30 min

60 min


Do not shutdown

In the Headset (*Hands-Free Set*) setting, select **Auto Pick Up** to enable the phone to automatically pick up incoming calls when the headset is being attached to the phone.

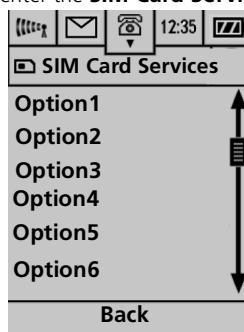

SIM Toolkit Services

The Motorola A6188 supports the various SIM Toolkit (STK) services offered by the network providers. This greatly enhances the capabilities of your Motorola A6188.

 *The features are dependent on whether the network providers offer the services and whether you have subscribed to the services.*

Your cellular service provider determines the messages associated with the SIM Toolkit services. In the Main menu, press  to enter the **SIM Card Services** display:

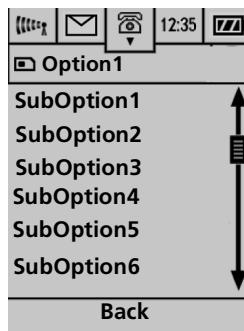

Games

The Motorola A6188 provides three classic games Wu Zi Qi, Hua Rong Dao and Memory. In the main menu, press  to list the games.



Press on the game name you wish to play.

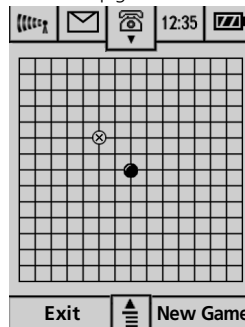
Wu Zi Qi


The game Wu Zi Qi is also known as Five Pawns. It originated from the ancient Chinese chess game of Go and is now featured in international competitions. The rules of Wu Zi Qi are simple but the game play is intricate in nature. The chessboard is a 15 by 15 grid. Two players each with either a black or a white sets of beads compete with each other. Each player takes turn to place a bead at a crosshair of the grid. The first player to form a string of five beads in a horizontal, vertical or diagonal line wins the game.

Using the *Motorola A6188*, you can compete with another person or play against the processor on the phone.

At international competition, the game has numerous rules. The international competition rules of play are available at the website <http://games.chinaroad.cn.net/wuziqi/>. The *Motorola A6188* does not follow entirely all the competition rules of play, but only uses a simplified set of rules. in order to regulate the first move player. If any rule is contravened, the first move player will lose the game.


Press **Wu Zi Qi** game to display the Wu Zi qi game screen.:



To begin the game, regardless of who makes the first move (selectable by pressing  for game options) the first bead always begin at the centre of the board.

Press on **New Game** to start a new game at any time. When it is your turn, use the Stylus to select the spot where you want to place the bead. You must attempt to form a string of five beads faster than your opponent does and at the same time prevent the other player from doing

the same. The phone will announce the result of the game by displaying **You Win!** or it will display **Phone Wins!**

Press  to select the following game options:

New Game

Select **New Game** option if you wish to start fresh game. Selecting New Game option before the current game is running asks you **Quit and Play New Game?** Press **OK** to continue.

Confirm Move: On/Off

Select between **On** or **Off**. If you choose On, the lower right hand corner of the screen will become OK. After you place your move, your opponent will not place yet. You can choose to change your move to another position until you press **OK**.

Opponent

In the **Opponent** dialogue box choose either **Phone** or **Another Player** as the second player. When selected **Phone**, check the **I Go First** box to determine which player goes first. Press **OK** to select.

Difficulty Level

In the **Opponent** dialogue box Select **Novice**, **Intermediate** or **Expert** by pressing respective radio button and press **OK** to continue.

Instructions

In the **Instructions** screen you see text instructions about playing the Wu Zi Qi game. Press scroll bar to read it fully. Press on **Exit** to return to the Wu Zi Qi game screen.

In the Wu Zi Qi game screen press on **Exit** to quit to the Game Menu.

Hua Rong Dao

The game of Hua Rong Dao originated from the story of the capture and release of King Cao Cao during the period of the three kingdoms of ancient China.

This is a traditional Chinese intellectual game of jig-saw. King Cao Cao holds four grids on the game board and has the largest square. Besides the King there are five Generals each holding a space of two grids squares, and soldiers of one grid square each. The King is surrounded by the Generals. Using the two empty grids you have to move the squares until the King reaches the exit point in the least number of steps.

At the main menu press  to enter the games menu. Press **Hua Rong Dao** to begin the game.



Press **New Game** to start a new game at any time

Press the squares (King's photo) on the board to move the squares to adjacent space available.

If a square does not have a space to move, pressing it will have no effect.


If the square has only one possible direction to move, pressing it will move it into that direction.

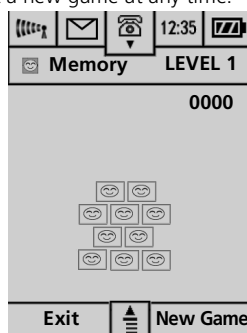
Every move is counted one by a counter.

If there are two possible directions to move, the pressed square will become highlighted. Just press on the desired space and the square will move into that direction. Every move on the board is counted one by the counter.

Press **Exit** to end the game and return to the Game Menu.

Memory

At the main menu press  to enter the games menu. Press **Memory** to begin the memory game. Press **New Game** to start a new game at any time.



At the start of the game you will see a few stacks of cards on the display. Each of them will be facing down. Click on the stacks to flip open the first card. The idea of this game is to remember the objects on the cards and match a same object on the subsequent click.

Once you have match on a subsequent click the two cards will remain open. If you do not have a match on the second click you need to click on a third card. If you do not get two matching cards from the three opened cards, all the three will close. If there is a pair of match among the 3 opened cards, the matching pair will remain open and the third one will close itself.

When all the cards are open you have completed the game! The counter will show you the number of errors you made and the number of tries you took to complete the game. The lesser the number of tries and errors, the better is your skill in this game of memory.

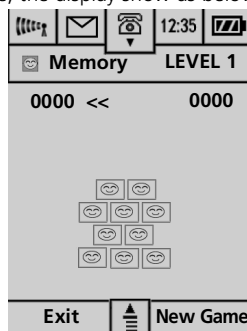
Press  to enter game options.

LEVEL 1 - 6: you can select any number from one to six for the Level of difficulty. The higher the level the more number of stacks.

2 Players: you can also select modes for single or double players.

Instructions: Press to open the instructions display. Scroll down to read the text.

If you choose double player mode, the display show as below:



On the top of the display there is a counter that gives the score of the active player. The player with a higher score on the counter will be the winner.

The << appears beside the score to indicate which player is active. The active player will continue to play until the marker changes to >> when his opponent takes over. If you have a match of cards opened, the active player will score one point. The game ends when all the cards are open.


Data Synchronization with PC

Synchronization Software

Through the *TrueSync* software, Motorola A6188 can send and receive communications log, appointments and email between itself and a PC (personal computer). This ensures that data on both sides is updated at all time.

Communications link between the PC and the Motorola A6188 can either be through a cable or by infrared connection.

Before using *PC Sync*, the *TrueSync* software must first be install on the PC. The software is in the accompanying CD-Rom.

 For further details, please refer to the *TrueSync* manual.


TrueSync can only be install on Windows 95/98.

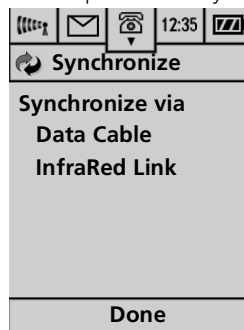
Installation

- 1 Power on the PC.
- 2 Put the *TrueSync* CD-ROM into the CD-Rom drive.
- 3 Press **Start** and select **Run**.
- 4 Type **X:\Setup** (X is the drive name).
- 5 Press **OK** to run the setup.
- 6 Follow the installation instruction to install the software.

Performing Data Synchronization

If a cable is used for the connection between the PC and the phone, please plug in the cable before the PC is power on.

- 1 Run the *TrueSync* software.
- 2 In the Main Menu, press  icon to enter the PC **Synchronize** display or press on *System Setting* and then press on *PC Sync* to enter the display.???



- 3 If cable is used, Press **Data Cable**.

If infrared connection is used, point the Motorola A6188 infrared interface at the PC's infrared receiver. Press on **InfraRed Link** and **Connecting...** will appear. If **Cancel** is pressed at this stage, the display will return to the PC Synchronize display.

- 4 If the connection is successful, the **Begin PC Sync?** dialogue box will appear.

Press on **Cancel** to return to the PC Sync display.

Press on **OK** to begin the process of synchronization.


If the infrared connection is broken for some reason or if the PC system hangs and synchronization is incomplete, it will return to the PC Synchronize display.

Data Synchronization with PC

- 5 In the process of synchronization, the following messages will appear: **Ready To Begin PC Sync, Reading, Synchronizing Appointment (or Message or Email), and Arranging.** In the process, pressing on *Cancel* will result in the message *PC Sync Cancelled*. Press on *OK* to return to the PC Sync screen.
- 6 When *PC Sync* is completed, the message **PC Sync Complete** will appear. Press on **OK** to return to the PC Sync display.

If the battery is low or if the infrared connection is broken or if the PC system hangs, *PC Sync* will terminate and the message **PC Sync Failure** will appear or the message **PC Sync Error - Check Record** will appear.

Checking the Data Synchronization Record

In the Main Menu, press  icon to enter the PC **Synchronize** display

or press on *System Setting* and then press on *PC Sync* to enter the display.???

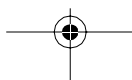
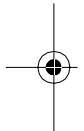
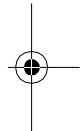
